To support the launch of online degree program offerings Edward Waters College is requesting \$1,000,000. This will come as a joint ask from the private HBCU's in Florida for a combined total of \$3,000,000 to create online learning at each institution.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The rationale for enhancing the online program is germane to the College's mission to prepare students holistically to advance in a global society through the provision of intellectually stimulating programs and an environment which emphasizes high moral and spiritual values. In the Fall of 2017, the college surveyed its almost 1,000 students assessing their interest in taking online courses at EWC. Findings show, a large number of those responding (75%) indicated great interest in taking online courses across all programs.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding will be used for the enhancement of the online learning environment infrastructure and faculty professional development in the areas of instructional design and best practices in online student engagement. Examples under consideration with this request include 24/7 technical and academic support services, mobile device access to the learning management system, and expanded instructional assessment tools. Likewise, a formalized system of professional development for faculty working in the online environment will ensure the college has the resources to train instructors on how to best teach online learners.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

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The opportunity to obtain a baccalaureate degree via online learning. Examples under consideration with this request include 24/7 technical and academic support services, mobile device access to the learning management system, and expanded instructional assessment tools.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Edward Waters College seeks to offer classes designed to fit the needs of a diverse population of students, this format of instructional courses will allow students to continue working while prioritizing higher education. In the Fall of 2017, the college surveyed its almost 1,000 students assessing their interest in taking online courses at EWC. Findings show, a large number of those responding (75%) indicated great interest in taking online courses across all programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

By enhancing EWC's online presence and offerings via online delivery— learner support and faculty training will directly impact student recruitment, enrollment, retention, and graduation rates in online programs. Ultimately, with ongoing guidance and support— EWC will increase student success, including on-time completion of their degrees, making them marketable in high-demand fields.
