The Pre-College Academy will give 200 selected students, who have been admitted and plan to matriculate at EWC, the opportunity to get an early start by earning 8-credit hours prior to the start of their first college semester in the fall. This program track includes a total of five weeks of intensive study in the subjects of English, Mathematics, and Leadership Development. This program will be surrounded by a wealth of academic support services such as tutoring, mentoring, supplemental instruction, self-paced labs, and experiences that include aspects of college orientation, campus-centered activities, and higher education socialization. Additionally, the Pre-College Academy will provide students with exposure to High-Demand Careers, and will give students the opportunity to meet with career professionals from various fields of study. The goal is to engage students prior to the start of college, with the effort of developing an understanding of both college and workforce readiness.

Therefore, we seek to enroll promising students from secondary schools to attend our summer pre-college academy. This program will be surrounded by a wealth of academic support services such as tutoring, mentoring, supplemental instruction, self-paced labs, and experiences that include aspects of

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college orientation, campus-centered activities, and higher education socialization. Additionally, the Pre-College Academy will provide students with exposure to High-Demand Careers, and will give students the opportunity to meet with career professionals from various fields of study.
