The sum of \$14,765,000 from the State School Trust Fund is appropriated to the Department of Education for the benefit of Miami-Dade County Public Schools from the sale of approximately 630 acres of Section 16 parcel in Miami-Dade County approved by the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund on February 8, 2018, for the purchase of the Young Women's Preparatory Academy.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

To purchase the land and building for Young Women's Preparatory Academy, a high-performing school that serves mainly minority students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. This would create a significant operations cost-savings over time for Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS). All of the following entities have already approved the sale of the land parcel and subsequent use of these funds to purchase said school: The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, Board of County Commissioners, Miami-Dade County, Florida, South Florida Water Management District Acquisition and Restoration Council (ARC), Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Proceeds were to go to the state school trust fund and the Florida Legislature needs to appropriate the funds to M-DCPS.

- What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 Public education for Miami-Dade students at a single-gender school.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The Young Women's Preparatory Academy is dedicated to excellence in the education of girls and young women. Our girls will actively pursue the opportunities of a rich and challenging curriculum and develop the wisdom and courage to lead in local and global communities. Through technology, students gain access to local and worldwide resources.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
 The students of Young Women's Preparatory Academy. The school has the capacity to serve 447 students each year.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

School Grade has been an "A" since 2008. M-DCPS will strive to continue to keep this school highly rated as it serves mostly minority students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch.
