The intent of this park project is to build a one mile, multi-purpose trail to provide low environmental impact eco-tourism based public aces across natural and cultural site resources from the Ferndale Preserve parking area to the western shore of Lake Apopka. Ferndale Preserve is a 196 acre conservation and restoration property located on the western shore of Lake Apopka and is a prime location for eco-tourism.

Passive outdoor "nature and cultural" based activities and education.

The outcome is to enhance the quality of life of Lake County residents by providing passive recreational opportunities and promoting conservation, preservation and protection of natural and cultural resources.
