1. Project Title Monroe County Keys-Wide Vessel Pump Out Program

3. **Date of Request** 11/04/2019

4. **Project/Program Description**

The Monroe County Keys-wide Mobile Vessel Pump Out Program (Program) provides free pump out service to vessels in areas or situations where suitable pump out facilities are not readily available. The Program, which began in 2013, protects the pristine waters of the Florida Keys and the valuable marine ecosystem by ensuring that the high numbers of boaters that come to the Keys comply with the No Discharge Zone that encompasses all the Florida Keys waters and properly dispose of their vessel sewage. The Program pumps out approximately 400,000 gallons of vessel sewage each year, that may otherwise end up in the water column. Since the program's inception, over 2 million gallons of sewage have been diverted from the Keys' waters. The Program is instrumental in maintaining water quality in the Keys and protecting the coral reef, seagrasses, fish and wildlife in the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The pristine waters of the Florida Keys attract high numbers of boaters from all over the State and Country. These waters are all part of the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary and house one of the most unique and sensitive marine ecosystems in the world, which supports highly valuable recreational and commercial fishing industries and tourist economy. Monroe County implemented the Keys-wide Mobile Pump Out Program ("Program") in 2013 to incentivize/encourage boaters' compliance with the requirements of Federal No Discharge Zone (which encompasses all of the waters surrounding the Florida Keys) in order to safeguard the quality of the Keys' waters. The Program has been hugely successful and has diverted over 2 million gallons of vessel sewage from Keys' waters.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Program provides weekly pump out services (at no charge in order to incentivize use) to vessels throughout the Florida Keys, in order to help them comply with the regulations of the No Discharge Zone. Diverting 2.1 million gallons of vessel sewage since the start of the program in 2013, the Program plays an important role in protecting the quality of water and the special marine ecosystem of the Florida Keys.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Program will deliver the same service it has over the past 12 months: it will provide approximately 26,400 pump outs to 3,200 vessels throughout the 100 miles of the Florida Keys, and divert approximately 412,000 gallons of vessel sewage from the water.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Program provides sewage pump out service to approximately 3,200 vessels in areas or situations where suitable pump out facilities are not readily available. The Program is provided and operated in a manner that encourages boaters to property and legally pump out their vessel in compliance with regulations of the No Discharge Zone, and furthermore encourages marinas to become self-sufficient in the provision of pump out services to their paying customers.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Program's success is measured by the number of pump outs, the number of vessels serviced and the number of gallons of sewage collected and diverted from Keys' waters. The Program's minimum monthly quota is now 2,200 pump outs, which began October 1, 2019.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Monroe County recognizes that program performance and success is critical to current and future funding assistance from the State for the program. The County has operated this program for 6 years. Each year it has exceeded its deliverables, increasing the number of pump outs, the number of vessels served and the number of gallons of vessel sewage collected and diverted. We anticipate meeting the deliverables, and the funding assistance from the State is reimbursement-based, so we only receive State's funding for the services when they have been provided. Should we fail to meet deliverables, the State may also consider withholding future program assistance.
