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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Reduced recidivism -- over last 10 years LEAP graduates have less than a 5% rate of return to prison. Increased employment among formerly incarcerated women who participate in LEAP. Increased housing among formerly incarcerated women who participate in LEAP. Reduced use of social services among LEAP graduates and their children.

- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
 - 1. In prison instruction for 50-60 women/year. 300+ hours of classes at the Homestead Correctional Institute for Women over 8 months that includes employment readiness, entrepreneurship and trauma informed substance abuse programming.
 - 2. Post release case management
 - 3. Post release paid job training
 - 4. Transitional Houseing
- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
 - 1.In prison education, covering life and employability skills, entrepreneurship training and entrepreneurship;
 - 2. Employment at LEAP's Dragonfly Thrift Boutique;
 - 3. Transitional Housing;
 - 4. Case Management.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Women incarcerated with the Florida Department of Corrections who are within one year of release. The number of women served includes 50-60 graduates per year and 100-150 additional women who receive post release follow up services.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
 - 1. 75% of LEAP grads with a history of addiction will continue with substance abuse program for 6 months post release, as measured by case manager follow up. 2. 90% of residents of LEAP house will remain sober and attend therapy for duration of their residence as measured by random testing and case manager follow up. 3. 85% of all Leap grad and 100% of those at LEAP house will have jobs with a living wage within 3 months of release, as measured by case manager follow up. 4. 96% of LEAP graduates will remain crime free, as measured by Department of Corrections data. 5. 100% of LEAP transitional house residents will obtain permanent housing within two years of their release from prison.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Provide a reasonable explanation for why performance objectives were not met and how monies were spent. The explanation should include what, if anything was learned, what steps can be taken and a timeline so that expected deliverables can me made in the future.
