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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

AMIkids Career & Job Placement Program provides follow up services to the current AMIkids Career Education to at-risk students. This program creates community hiring partnerships, resume and interview services, mentoring, and career coaching. Students are given an opportunity to find meaningful career options that prepare them to make better choices and contribute to their community. Students will have improved academic outcomes, increased job readiness skills, and reduced recidivism.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Students will engage in learning opportunities that teach workplace readiness, which may include understanding personal qualities and employable traits, self-management skills, team work, professionalism, job-seeking skills, and personal finance. Students will participate in career fairs, mock interviews, job shadowing, as well as engage in mentoring and apprenticeship placements. As appropriate, students will visit vocational schools, community colleges and universities, and other community experiences to increase their exposure to future opportunities and expand their understanding of potential career options. Each activity will align with preparing students to re-engage in school and work opportunities that lead them toward becoming taxpaying citizens. Students will also receive career-focused mentoring through our partnership with Volunteer Florida's Americorps program. Mentors coach students using the AMIkids Career Readiness curriculum to help prepare and place them in jobs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will receive guidance, instruction, and support that leads to their preparation for successfully securing and maintaining a job in their local community. Services will include instruction in career readiness content, coordination of community resources and agencies that prepare youth for employment and diminish delinquent behavior, and access to job recruiters who will work with potential employers interested in supporting youth in need of help getting on the right track.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Persons with poor mental health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, grade school students, high school students, currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders (in criminal justice). Between 500 and 800 students can be served by these funds.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
