TI	he overall goal is to provide support, resources and opportunities for participants to better themselves and ensure a successful future.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The McGill Center will prepare Youth in Gadsden County with the learning experiences that prepare them to be active, creative, knowledgeable, and ethical participants in the greater community. The Program will offer:

- Character development
- · Activities aimed at restoring self-esteem, self-confidence and trust
- Academic tutoring
- · Referrals for individual, mental health and drug counseling
- Saturday Sports/Activities Program
- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The program will assist in transforming the lives of youth through training, community service, and sustainable wages and jobs. The project will be a community-based alternative education program that provides job training and educational opportunities for youth offenders, ages 16 to 24. The project will combine classroom instruction and real-world projects that prepare participants for the workplace. The job skills training will focus on careers that are in-demand in the Big Bend area: Restaurant and Hospitality, Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) Certification, and the SafeServ Food Handler Certification. Youth will receive industry recognized credentials while earning a paycheck and practicing the hands-on skills needed for success.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will be a community-based alternative education program that provides job training and educational opportunities for at-risk youth, disabled youth, and youth offenders, ages 16 to 24. The project will combine classroom instruction and real-world projects that prepare participants for the workplace.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Program will consist of a two-Phased program. During Phased 1, youth will be offered life skills, character-based curriculum, mentors, tutors, and additional services such as family, individual, and drug counseling, and, Phase2 will include 6-month of education, career development, community service, and transitional programming. The program proposes to serve a minimum of 150-200 youth, lower the recidivism rates by 50%, lower crime rates, build safer communities, produce productive citizens, and build better functioning families. As a result, the youth will have the unique experience of having an opportunity to improve the world around them and local residents will witness young people taking responsibility for the development of their own lives and their community.
