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a.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	To build a pipeline to connect opportunity youth to educational opportunities, jobs and skills building initiatives through the city of Tallahassee Engaged in Meaningful Productivity for Opportunity youth (TEMPO) and the Tallahassee Future Leaders Academy (TFLA) programs.
b.	What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
	The re-engagement of Opportunity Youth, the implementation of the (7) phases of case management, GEDs through local adult & community education provider, workforce training programs at local educational and technical center and apprenticeships with local business partners.
C.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	The improvement of their respective communities, public safety, quality of life and impact on poverty.
d.	Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
	The target population includes jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and the homeless. Greater than 800 individuals are expected to be served by this project.
e.	What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
	The project is expected to improve cultural experience. This can be measured by participation reports. Furthermore, the project is expected to improve quality of education. This can be measured by high school degrees/GEDs awarded as a result of the program and enrollment and graduation data for program participants in college, technical, or vocational school. Additionally, the project will protect the general public from harm by decreasing the number of program participants committing crimes. This can be measured by system crime data obtained from local and state agencies. The project will also improve transportation conditions by issuing City of Tallahassee bus passes. This outcome can be measured using Star Metro transportation data. Furthermore, the project will increase or improve economic activity which can be measured by the workforce training and jobs report. Similarly, the project will create specific immediate job opportunities.
