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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

ROW acquisition, planning, and engineering of an extension to William Burgess Boulevard to provide an alternate east-west route between US 17 through Miner Road to the Amelia Concourse, alleviating citizen and commerce delays when using SR 200/AIA which is part of the State Inter-model System (SIS). b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Creation of an alternate east-west route between US 17 through Miner Road to the Amelia Concourse, alleviating citizen and commerce delays when using SR 200/AIA which is part of the State Inter-model System (SIS). This two-lane connection will increase accessibility to Yulee middle and high schools, reduce traffic on the SIS, and improve capacity on roadways of regional and state significance. The new roadway is planned to feature a multi-use trail for bicycle and pedestrian use.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All users of SR200/A1A including Port of Fernandina and commerce traffic. In addition, the 5,000+/- citizens who either live in the Wilson Neck area of Yulee, the students, parents, and faculty of Yulee middle and high schools, and localized service providers.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduced congestion along the SR 200 corridor from US 17 to CR 107 and at the Miner Road SR 200 signalized intersection. Traffic counts will be used to measure outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The FDOT funding for many other roadway and transportation projects would be jeopardized.
