a.	What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?
	Funds will help to ensure the consortium is solvent. Since the consortium advanced coverage for deductibles incurred by colleges (3% of value), in the wake of the past three hurricane seasons, the FCS requests \$18 million to backfill the cost of those deductibles to ensure the consortium is solvent when future impacts are incurred.

	Repairs and maintenance to college facilities impacted by recent storms and other events and continued support of colleges' facilities in case of future storm impacts.
c.	What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
	Repairs and maintenance to college facilities impacted by recent storms and other events and continued support of colleges' facilities in case of future storm impacts.

	College students throughout Florida, including those that are developmentally disabled or physically disabled, will be served by the funding. There are approximately 800,000 students in the Florida College System.
