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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Expanded post secondary training programs in non-traditional, high interest career areas including art, retail, equine, and cafe programs, utilizing community based instruction, hands on training, and virtual reality for persons with significant disabilities in competitive employment and supported employment settings.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Development of micro-enterprises, job coaching, vocational assessments, post secondary job training services, virtual reality vocational training.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Skill development, job coaching, and instruction in non-traditional rehab settings including equine services, art, retail, entertainment, and cafe services to develop, increase, and maintain job skills for the unemployed and underemployed, targeted to increase employability, job skills, social skills and to retain skills.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, those with developmental disabilities, physically disabled persons and persons attending college and vocational training. Minimum persons served will be 150.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increased involvement in the community, decreased rates of isolation and loneliness, increased vocational skills and employability rating, increased number of persons employed. Pre and Post instructional assessments will measure outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

If measurable outcomes are not achieved, agency will develop a plan to address deficiencies to meet outcomes. Penalties may include increased service provision or reduction in funding.
