### 11. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This program will directly impact the student and the classroom. By providing the parent/guardian with parenting skills to bring peace to the home and ultimately, the classroom. Once there is a parenting plan in place, parents will then be empowered to deal with their own frustration, and then the child. Because the teacher is involved in the process on a daily basis with the parent, the child will become a better student who will then become a better citizen. This model will make our community and state a safer place to raise our families and reduce crime at the same time.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Empowered Parent Conference, Success Camp, weekly support, and accountability. When the child is suspended, they will be picked up with their books and schoolwork and brought to our facility. The child will stay with us for the number of suspension days. That suspension will also result in said child, being on restriction and spending the weekend at our facility. The parent also is provided some relief through respite care while the child is with us.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

When a child understands, they control their fun times by the choices they make, and better choices will show up in the classroom. A calmer classroom will allow a student to learn because the learning environment is calmer. The better the learning environment, then the better a child will be as a student. Better students are not engaging with law enforcement and are better citizens.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elementary and middle age students are the target population. These children will have anger management issues, ADD, ADHD, and all the other behavioral issues. Because its a pilot program, we will have two separate six-month programs. Each group will serve 12 families. Because its a pilot program, we need the number small so we can track each child, each classroom, and the home. Because we are training the parents on what to do, the techniques will be applied to all the children in the home. The number of children served could be as high as 50. But that isn't going to be the biggest Return on Investment (ROI. The ROI will come when our client base is 40 children per day and the children that are still at home as well.

## e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Because the school already has up to date records, we will be able to show a change child in six months. Improved parenting - this is what sets us apart, because they will also be supportive parents. The child will have better grades, reduced suspensions, and less law enforcement involvement. Last, but just as importantly, happier teachers.
