### 4. **Project/Program Description**

HANDY (Helping Abused, Neglected, Disadvantaged Youth) is an award-winning 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that has met the needs of more than 50,000 children in foster and relative/nonrelative care associated with the child dependency system. Requested state funding will enhance HANDY's successful Scholars Program, providing ongoing academic services, post-secondary education linkage, scholarships, and housing for at-risk youth in post-secondary education and training throughout the state. 25% of youth surveyed in the 2018 Florida National Youth in Transition Database Survey were not enrolled in a high school or GED program, vocational institution, or college, citing financial, academic, child care, transportation, and housing barriers. Last year, 41% of youth ages 18-22 reported having to couch surf to avoid homelessness and 26% spent anywhere from 1 night to the entire year living in homelessness. 24% reported that they cannot afford living expenses after paying rent.

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### 11. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

HANDY's Scholars Program enables youth to stay in school, understand their educational and employment options, and to learn to make positive life choices. The goal to be achieved by the funds is to provide at-risk youth with the emotional, financial, and academic support to successfully complete a post-secondary credential. Ultimately, this project will increase their self-sustainability and future earning potential, helping them become responsible, productive, independent adult taxpayers as well as mentors and leaders within their community.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The program provides youth post-secondary education financial and personal support, which includes: Education case management throughout youth's post-secondary education; assessment of eligibility and linkage to tuition exemptions; tuition to attend technical schools/certificate programs; scholarships for books/supplies/living stipends; assistance in completing all applications; emergency assistance for food, rent, utilities, clothing, and healthcare; and stable housing during post-secondary career.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

With preparation being the key factor, a comprehensive Educational LIFE Plan (ELP) is completed with each youth, which helps the student identify/meet all necessary educational goals set by his or her individual school. The High School ELP addresses immediate educational needs, testing information, graduation audit explanation, and an educational plan for the year that the youth will need to complete in order to stay on track to graduate from high school. The College ELP is to assist the youth with registration and understanding the youth's degree audit. Through partnership with FLITE (Fort Lauderdale Independence Training and Education) Center, housing will also be provided for youth entering post-secondary education in areas that suit the youth's life and needs.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

HANDY's scholars are from households with incomes at or below 100% of federal poverty level and the scholars represent a demographic crosssection of economically disadvantaged, abused, neglected, or abandoned inner-city youth, ages 17-23. They may be adjudicated dependent youth or youth in non-adjudicated relative or non-relative care. The majority of these youth are living with relative/non-relative caregivers who do not receive the support and services available to youth in foster care or foster care youth who may not qualify for extended foster care (EFC) or post-secondary education support services (PESS). HANDY scholars are 86% African American/Caribbean, 10% Caucasian, 3% Hispanic, and 1% Other. Twentyeight percent (28%) of children currently served by HANDY are in foster care and 72% are children living with relative/non relative caregivers.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcomes of the project include:

- $^{\ast}$  85% of youth will remain in school and be promoted to the next grade.
- $^{\ast}$  85% of youth will decrease risky behavior and avoid law violations.

\* 100% of youth will not use alcohol or drugs.

\* 95% of youth will graduate high school and 100% of those graduates will enroll in post-secondary education.

\* 68% of youth will complete post-secondary education (the national completion rate for similar populations is 3%).

Academic records, background checks, pay stubs/employment verification, & self-assessments are collected to measure outcomes and validate data.
