4. **Project/Program Description**

Senior Center programming and nutrition has been expanded to four additional centers located in (Southwest Dade, Fontainebleau, Little Havana and East Hialeah). Southwest Social Services Programs, Inc. provides services to 9 senior centers in Miami-Dade. These services include meals, transportation, recreation, education, screening & assessments, FarmShare, information/referral, nutrition counseling and nutrition education. This is done through funds/donations from federal, state, county and city government as well as United Way funds and private donations. The funding we are seeking will provide for a site manager, rent, clerical person and required/desired programming.

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11. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Socialization is as critical to maintaining older adults active as the meal. This funding will be used for direct services in the senior centers including a site manager, teachers and recreational/educational programming.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will be used for a site manager who would be responsible for the center including intake, screening & assessments. They would also be used for instructors/teachers in subject matters such as English classes, exercise/dance, technology and seminars. The funds would also be for programming such as field trips to community events, special events and sites.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Screening and assessments, classes, special events (tournaments, celebrations), field trips (museums, health fairs, community events).

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly population in Miami-Dade County. The older adults are mostly minorities, low income, females over the age of 65. Approximately 750 seniors would receive at least one of the services listed in c.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefits would be the prevention of isolation, community engagement, learning skills (technology & English) and socialization. Outcomes will be measured through satisfaction surveys, advisory councils and hours of service.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Southwest Social Services Programs, Inc. has been serving South Florida since 1981. We provide services to nine senior centers and approximately 400 hot home delivered meals participants. This contract would be for reimbursement thus no funds would be requested that had not been used.
