I of the State Constitution. Personal identifying information includes a 26 27 customer's name; social security number; taxpayer identification number; address; telephone number; bank account 28 29 number; debit, charge, and credit card numbers; and driver identification number. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that a customer's social security number; taxpayer 7 identification number; bank account number; and debit, charge, 8 and credit card numbers made exempt by this act be held exempt 9 10 from public disclosure because such numbers are sensitive, 11 personal information that if released creates the opportunity for identify theft and fraud. Additionally, the social 12 security number is the only nationwide, unique numeric form of 13 identification. Release of a customer's social security number 14 is of concern due to the amount of information such number can 15 provide about an individual. A social security number is often 16 17 the link to an individual's personal records, whether such records are financial, educational, medical, or familial in 18 19 nature. Furthermore, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that personal identifying information regarding a 20 customer of such utility be held exempt because release of 21 such identifying information creates a competitive 22 disadvantage for an agency owned or operated utility. A 23 24 private utility is not required by law to disclose any of its 25 customer records to the public. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 26 27 law. 28 29 30 31

9	operāted instead of simply jūst owned by a public entity;
10 11	It provides for retroactive application of the exemption; and
12	It rewords the statement of public necessity to provide
13	more specificity as to the need for the exemption.
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
