recommendations for their placement into appropriate 1 work-related training programs. 2 3 (7) The association, in cooperation with the 4 Department of Revenue, the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury 5 Program in the Department of Health, the Florida Medicaid 6 program in the Agency for Health Care Administration, a 7 representative from the state attorney's office in each of the 8 judicial circuits counties participating in the pilot program, 9 the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation 10 of the Department of Education, shall develop a plan for 11 12 implementation of the pilot program.
