STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1248 The committee substitute (CS) requires the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) to review and recommend appropriate statutory changes affecting land sales, exemptions, and mandatory homeowner's associations and disclosure laws related to adult and residential subdivisions. This CS provides that OPPAGA will consider input from various sources, hold public meetings to obtain input, and report its findings and recommendations to the Governor, President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by February 1, 2004. Also, the CS deletes provisions creating the 39-member "Mandated Property Reform Task Force" charged with reviewing and recommending statutory changes affecting land sales, exemptions, and mandatory homeowner's associations and disclosure laws related to adult and residential subdivisions; requiring a preliminary and final report from the task force; and appropriating \$50,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Office of Legislative Services for administrative expenses associated with the task force.
