The participants of a neighborhood crime watch program shall include, but need not be limited to, 20 residents of the county or municipality and owners of 21 22 businesses located within the county or municipality. 23 Harassment of participant of neighborhood Section 2. crime watch program prohibited; penalty; definition .--24 25 (1) It is a misdemeanor of the first degree for a 26 person to willfully harass a person who is a member of a neighborhood crime watch group for the purpose of intimidating 27 2.8 or retaliating against that person for his or her 29 participation in a neighborhood crime watch program. It is a 30 violation of this section for a person to harass a member of a

to or from a neighborhood crime watch meeting, actively participating in a neighborhood crime watch meeting or activity, or actively participating in an ongoing criminal investigation, as designated by a law enforcement officer. As used in this section, the term "harass" means to engage in a course of conduct directed at a specific person which causes substantial emotional distress in that person and serves no legitimate purpose. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. ********** SENATE SUMMARY Authorizes the establishment of neighborhood crime watch programs within a county or municipality by the sheriff or municipal police department. Provides that it is a first-degree misdemeanor to harass a participant of a neighborhood crime watch program for the purpose of intimidating or retaliating against that person for his or her participation in the neighborhood crime watch program.
