Subsection (3) of section 287.17, Florida 14 15 Statutes, is amended to read: 287.17 Limitation on use of motor vehicles and 16 17 aircraft.--(3)(a) The term "official state business" may not be 18 19 construed to permit the use of a motor vehicle or aircraft for 20 commuting purposes, unless special assignment of a motor vehicle is authorized as a perquisite by the Department of 21 22 Management Services, required by an employee after normal duty hours to perform duties of the position to which assigned, or 23 24 authorized for an employee whose home is the official base of 25 operation. 26 (b) For motor vehicles used by a state employee whose duties are those of a law enforcement officer, as defined in 27 2.8 s. 943.10, the term "official state business" shall be 29 construed to permit the use of the vehicle during normal duty hours to and from lunch or meal breaks and incidental stops 30

for personal errands, but not substantial deviations from

1 official state business, if such use is at the direction of or 2 with the permission of the agency head. 3 Section 2. Section 284.311, Florida Statutes, is 4 created to read: 5 284.311 Property damage coverage for state-owned 6 vehicles.--If a state employee whose duties are those of a law 7 enforcement officer, as defined in s. 943.10, uses the motor 8 vehicle for off-duty work for which he or she must reimburse 9 the state, that reimbursement must include a reimbursement for 10 property damage coverage on the motor vehicle while it is used 11 for the off-duty work. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. 21 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1934 22 23 24 Amends and expands the definition of the term, "official state business" in s. 287.17, F.S, to include the use of a vehicle by a state law enforcement officer during normal duty hours to and from lunch breaks or meal breaks and incidental stops for personal errands but not substantial deviations from official 25 26 27 state business. 28 Requires a state law enforcement officer who uses a vehicle 29 for off-duty work for which reimbursement to the state is required to provide reimbursement to the state for the actual costs rather than the reasonable costs of property damage coverage associated with such off-duty use of the vehicle. 30 31
