5	and body weight; authorizing the department to

8	320.08058, F.S.; requiring the Florida Sports
9	Foundation to allocate certain proceeds from
10	the sale of license plates for additional
11	purposes; providing an effective date.

13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
14	
15	Section 1. $(1)$ The Department of Health shall promote
16	healthy lifestyles to reduce the prevalence of overweight and
17	obesity in Florida by implementing appropriate physical
18	activity and nutrition programs that target all Floridians by:
19	(a) Using all appropriate media to promote maximum
20	public awareness of the latest research on healthy lifestyles
21	and chronic diseases and disseminating relevant information
22	through a statewide clearinghouse relating to wellness,
23	physical activity, and nutrition and their impact on chronic
24	diseases and disabling conditions.
25	(b) Providing technical assistance, training, and
26	resources on healthy lifestyles and chronic diseases to the
27	public, county health departments, health care providers,
28	school districts, and other persons or entities, including
28 29	school districts, and other persons or entities, including faith-based organizations, that request such assistance to
29	faith-based organizations, that request such assistance to

1	(c) Developing, implementing, and using all available
2	research methods to collect data, including, but not limited
3	to, population-specific data, and track the incidence and
4	effects of weight-gain, obesity, and related chronic diseases.
5	The department shall include an evaluation and data collection
6	component in all programs as appropriate.
7	(d) Partnering with the Department of Education, local
8	communities, school districts, and other entities to encourage
9	Florida schools to adopt minimum recommended nutrition
10	standards based on the latest research and to promote
11	activities during and after school to help students meet a
12	minimum goal of 60 minutes of activity per day.
13	(e) Partnering with the Department of Education,
14	school districts, and the Florida Sports Foundation to develop
15	a program that recognizes schools whose students demonstrate
16	excellent physical fitness or fitness improvement.
17	(f) Maximizing all local, state, and federal funding
18	sources, including grants, public-private partnerships, and
19	other mechanisms, to strengthen the department's current
20	physical activity and nutrition programs and to enhance
21	similar county health department programs.
22	(2) The department may adopt rules pursuant to
23	sections 120.536(1) and 120.54, Florida Statutes, to
24	administer this section.
25	(3) This section shall be implemented contingent on an
26	appropriation in the General Appropriations Act.
27	Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (9) of section
28	320.08058, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1 (b) The license plate annual use fees are to be 2 annually distributed as follows: 3 1. Fifty-five percent of the proceeds from the Florida Professional Sports Team plate must be deposited into the 4 5 Professional Sports Development Trust Fund within the Office б of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. These funds must 7 be used solely to attract and support major sports events in 8 this state. As used in this subparagraph, the term "major sports events" means, but is not limited to, championship or 9 10 all-star contests of Major League Baseball, the National 11 Basketball Association, the National Football League, the National Hockey League, the men's and women's National 12 13 Collegiate Athletic Association Final Four basketball championship, or a horseracing or dogracing Breeders' Cup. All 14 15 funds must be used to support and promote major sporting events, and the uses must be approved by the Florida Sports 16 17 Foundation. The remaining proceeds of the Florida Professional 2. 18 19 Sports Team license plate must be allocated to the Florida 20 Sports Foundation, a direct-support organization of the Office 21 of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. These funds must be deposited into the Professional Sports Development Trust 22 Fund within the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 23 24 Development. These funds must be used by the Florida Sports 25 Foundation to promote the economic development of the sports industry; to distribute licensing and royalty fees to 26 participating professional sports teams; to promote education 27 28 programs in Florida schools that provide an awareness of the 29 benefits of physical activity and nutrition standards; to 30 partner with the Department of Education and the Department of 31 Health to develop a program that recognizes schools whose

1 students demonstrate excellent physical fitness or fitness 2 improvement; to institute a grant program for communities 3 bidding on minor sporting events that create an economic impact for the state; to distribute funds to Florida-based 4 5 charities designated by the Florida Sports Foundation and the б participating professional sports teams; and to fulfill the 7 sports promotion responsibilities of the Office of Tourism, 8 Trade, and Economic Development.

The Florida Sports Foundation shall provide an 9 3. annual financial audit in accordance with s. 215.981 of its 10 11 financial accounts and records by an independent certified public accountant pursuant to the contract established by the 12 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development as 13 specified in s. 288.1229(5). The auditor shall submit the 14 audit report to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic 15 Development for review and approval. If the audit report is 16 17 approved, the office shall certify the audit report to the Auditor General for review. 18

4. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year only and
notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraphs 1. and 2.,
proceeds from the Professional Sports Development Trust Fund
may also be used for operational expenses of the Florida
Sports Foundation and financial support of the Sunshine State
Games. This subparagraph expires July 1, 2004.
Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
