and Debt Service Trust Fund; Classrooms First Program funds 2 provided in s. 1013.68; effort index grant funds provided in s. 1013.73; nonvoted 2-mill levy of ad valorem property taxes provided in s. 1011.71(2); Classrooms for Kids Infrastructure Program funds provided in s. 1013.735; or District Effort Recognition Program funds provided in s. 1013.736 for any new construction of educational plant space with a total cost per student station, including change orders, that equals more than:

- a. \$12,755 for an elementary school,
- b. \$14,624 for a middle school, or
- c. \$19,352 for a high school,

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(January 2002) as adjusted annually to reflect increases or decreases in the Construction Cost Consumer Price Index and further adjusted by a local geographic factor.

- 2. A district school board must not use funds from the Public Education Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund or the School District and Community College District Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund for any new construction of an ancillary plant that exceeds 70 percent of the average cost per square foot of new construction for all schools.
 - (d) The department shall:
- 1. Compute for each calendar year the statewide average construction costs for facilities serving each instructional level, for relocatable educational facilities, for administrative facilities, and for other ancillary and auxiliary facilities. The department shall compute the statewide average costs per student station for each instructional level.

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2. Annually review the actual completed construction	
costs of educational facilities in each school district. For	
any school district in which the total actual cost per student	
station, including change orders, exceeds the statewide limits	
established in paragraph (b), the school district shall report	
to the department the actual cost per student station and the	
reason for the school district's inability to adhere to the	
limits established in paragraph (b). The department shall	
collect all such reports and shall report to the Governor, the	
President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of	
Representatives by December 31 of each year a summary of each	
school district's spending in excess of the cost per student	
station provided in paragraph (b) as reported by the school	
districts.	

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Cost per student station includes contract costs, legal and administrative costs, fees of architects and engineers, furniture and equipment, and site improvement costs. Cost per student station does not include the cost of purchasing or leasing the site for the construction or the cost of related offsite improvements or parking garages.

(f) The commissioner may adopt rules that:

- 1. Set standards for granting waivers from the requirements of this chapter related to cost ceilings for specialized educational centers; and
- 2. Allow the costs associated with unusual site and construction conditions to be deducted from the cost per student station.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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********** SENATE SUMMARY Provides that the annual adjustment of the maximum allowable construction cost per student station must be based on the Construction Cost Index and a local geographic factor, not the Consumer Price Index. Provides that the cost per student station does not include certain costs related to parking garages. Allows the Commissioner of Education to make rules that set standards for granting waivers from the requirements of ch. 1013, F.S., related to cost ceilings for specialized educational centers and rules allowing the costs associated with unusual site and construction conditions to be deducted from the cost per student station.
