Subsection (2)(c)1. of section 101.68, 3 Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 4 101.68 Canvassing of absentee ballot.--5 б (2)(a) The county canvassing board may begin the 7 canvassing of absentee ballots at 7 a.m. on the fourth day before the election, but not later than noon on the day 8 following the election. In addition, for any county using 9 10 electronic tabulating equipment, the processing of absentee 11 ballots through such tabulating equipment may begin at 7 a.m. on the fourth day before the election. However, 12 notwithstanding any such authorization to begin canvassing or 13 otherwise processing absentee ballots early, no result shall 14 15 be released until after the closing of the polls in that county on election day. Any supervisor of elections, deputy 16 supervisor of elections, canvassing board member, election 17 board member, or election employee who releases the results of 18 19 a canvassing or processing of absentee ballots prior to the 20 closing of the polls in that county on election day commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 21 22 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. (b) To ensure that all absentee ballots to be counted 23 24 by the canvassing board are accounted for, the canvassing board shall compare the number of ballots in its possession 25 with the number of requests for ballots received to be counted 2.6 according to the supervisor's file or list. 27 (c)1. 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1 registered in the county and to determine the legality of that absentee ballot. The ballot of an elector who casts an 2 absentee ballot shall be counted even if the elector dies on 3 4 or before election day. An absentee ballot shall be considered illegal if it does not include the signature of the elector, 5 as shown by the registration records. However, an absentee 6 7 ballot shall not be considered illegal if the signature of the elector does not cross the seal of the mailing envelope. If 8 the canvassing board determines that any ballot is illegal, a 9 10 member of the board shall, without opening the envelope, mark 11 across the face of the envelope: "rejected as illegal." The envelope and the ballot contained therein shall be preserved 12 in the manner that official ballots voted are preserved. 13 14 15 (Redesignate subsequent sections.) 16 17 18 19 And the title is amended as follows: 20 On page 1, line 8-12, delete those lines 21 22 and insert: amending s. 101.68(1), F.S.; providing that 23 2.4 electors who die on or before election day and have cast an absentee ballot shall remain on 25 the voter registration books until the election 26 is certified; amending s. 101.68(2)(c)1, F.S.; 27 providing that the ballot of an elector who 28 29 casts an absentee ballot shall be counted even if the elector dies on or before election day; 30 31 providing an effective date. 3 s0506.ee34.002 8:32 AM 02/22/05
