Subsection (5) of section 768.28, Florida 16 17 Statutes, is amended to read: 768.28 Waiver of sovereign immunity in tort actions; 18 recovery limits; limitation on attorney fees; statute of 19 limitations; exclusions; indemnification; risk management 20 21 programs.--22 (5) The state and its agencies and subdivisions shall 23 be liable for tort claims in the same manner and to the same extent as a private individual under like circumstances, but 2.4 liability shall not include punitive damages or interest for 25 the period before judgment. Neither the state nor its 26 27 agencies or subdivisions shall be liable to pay a claim or a 2.8 judgment by any one person which exceeds the sum of \$100,000 or any claim or judgment, or portions thereof, which, when 29 30 totaled with all other claims or judgments paid by the state or its agencies or subdivisions arising out of the same

incident or occurrence, exceeds the sum of \$200,000. 2 Notwithstanding the limited waiver of sovereign immunity provided in this subsection, a claim may be made and a 3 4 judgment rendered in excess of these amounts, and the claim or judgment may be settled and paid from insurance proceeds or 5 otherwise available funds in whole or in part by the state or 7 an agency or subdivision thereof, including for an amount in 8 excess of the limits of liability specified in this subsection, without further act of the Legislature. However, 9 if the state or an agency or subdivision thereof does not 10 agree to pay that portion of a judgment rendered against it 11 12 which is in excess of the limits of liability specified in 13 this subsection, a judgment or judgments may be claimed and rendered in excess of these amounts and may be settled and 14 paid pursuant to this act up to \$100,000 or \$200,000, as the 15 16 case may be; and that portion of the judgment which that 17 exceeds these amounts may be reported to the Legislature, but 18 may be paid in part or in whole only by further act of the Legislature. Neither Notwithstanding the limited waiver of 19 sovereign immunity provided herein, the state or an agency or 20 21 subdivision thereof may agree, within the limits of insurance 2.2 coverage provided, to settle a claim made or a judgment 23 rendered against it without further action by the Legislature, 2.4 but the state <u>nor an</u> or agency or subdivision thereof shall not be deemed to have waived any defense of sovereign immunity 2.5 26 or to have increased the limits of its liability as a result 27 of its obtaining insurance coverage for tortious acts in 2.8 excess of the \$100,000 or \$200,000 waiver provided above or as 29 a result of its having agreed to a settlement or to pay a judgment in an amount exceeding the limitations of liability. 30 The limitations of liability set forth in this subsection

8	Allows a state agency or subdivision to settle and pay a
9	judgment in an amount that exceeds the limits on the waiver of sovereign immunity which are set forth in s.
10	768.28, F.S., without requiring a claim bill, if both parties agree to the settlement. Provides that such a settlement or payment does not waive the defense of
11	sovereign immunity or increase the agency's limits of liability.
