Section 1002.371, Florida Statutes, is 9 created to read: 10 1002.371 Governor's School for Science and Technology. -- The Governor's School for Science and Technology 11 12 is established within the Florida K-20 public education system 13 and shall be administratively housed within the Department of Education. 14 (1) The mission of the Governor's School for Science 15 and Technology is to provide advanced educational 16 opportunities in the areas of science, mathematics, 18 engineering, and technology in a residential setting with highly qualified scientists and instructors organized and 19 provided in short periods of intensive specialized real-life 2.0 21 <u>learning experiences for highly motivated and talented</u> 22 students in grades 9 through 12. 23 (2) The school shall be located in Brevard County and be situated where a formal partnership between the school and 2.4 the Kennedy Space Center may readily be established and 2.5 maintained to provide real-life learning experiences for 26 27 students. The attendance area for the school is the entire 2.8 state; however, admission to the school is a privilege reserved for those qualified students who are selected through 29 a statewide application and qualification system and is not a 30 right afforded to the general population of students in this

Τ	state. Students enrolled in the school must reside on the
2	school's premises and be under the control of the school.
3	(3) The board of trustees created in subsection (5)
4	shall take such actions as are necessary for planning and
5	establishing the Governor's School for Science and Technology
6	as provided in this section. The board shall submit a progress
7	report to the Commissioner of Education, the Governor, the
8	President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
9	Representatives by January 1, 2008, which must include a

29	schools, community colleges, state universities and other
30	postsecondary educational institutions, other educational
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institutions, and other educational services as provided or authorized by the Constitution and laws of the state.

(5) THE GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL FOR SCIENCE AND

TECHNOLOGY.--The Governor's School for Science and Technology
is a component of the delivery of public education within

Florida's K-20 education system.

Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (6) of section 1002.20, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1002.20 K-12 student and parent rights.--Parents of public school students must receive accurate and timely information regarding their child's academic progress and must be informed of ways they can help their child to succeed in school. K-12 students and their parents are afforded numerous statutory rights including, but not limited to, the following:

- (6) EDUCATIONAL CHOICE. --
- (a) Public school choices.--Parents of public school students may seek whatever public school choice options that are applicable to their students and are available to students in their school districts. These options may include controlled open enrollment, lab schools, charter schools, charter technical career centers, magnet schools, alternative schools, special programs, advanced placement, dual enrollment, International Baccalaureate, International General Certificate of Secondary Education (pre-AICE), Advanced International Certificate of Education, early admissions, credit by examination or demonstration of competency, the New World School of the Arts, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, the Governor's School for Science and Technology, and the Florida Virtual School. These options may also include the public school choice options of the Opportunity

Scholarship Program and the McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program.

Section 4. Paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 1003.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.02 District school board operation and control of public K-12 education within the school district.—As provided in part II of chapter 1001, district school boards are constitutionally and statutorily charged with the operation and control of public K-12 education within their school district. The district school boards must establish, organize, and operate their public K-12 schools and educational programs, employees, and facilities. Their responsibilities include staff development, public K-12 school student education including education for exceptional students and students in juvenile justice programs, special programs, adult education programs, and career education programs.

Additionally, district school boards must:

- (1) Provide for the proper accounting for all students of school age, for the attendance and control of students at school, and for proper attention to health, safety, and other
- 21 matters relating to the welfare of students in the following 22 fields:
- (i) Parental notification of acceleration
 mechanisms.—At the beginning of each school year, notify
 parents of students in or entering high school of the
 opportunity and benefits of advanced placement, International
 Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of
 Education, dual enrollment, the Governor's School for Science
 and Technology, and Florida Virtual School courses.

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4	-The mission of the Governor's School for Science and Technology will also include advanced educational
5	opportunities in engineering.
6 7	-The school shall be established within the K-20 public education system and administratively housed in the Department of Education.
8	-The school will be managed by a 7-member board of trustees, rather than operated by the Florida Virtual School.
9	-The board will be responsible for planning and establishing
10	the school; appointing the staff; procuring professional and legal services; determining student eligibility and enrollment; developing application procedures; providing
12	housing, food, and transportation; providing accounting and budgeting operations; entering into contracts; taking legal
