| 21 | (3) School personnel may not participate in or |
| 22 | otherwise influence the exercise of the discretion of the |

| 25 | Section 2. The purpose of this act is to provide for |
| 26 | the solemnization and memorialization of events and ceremonies |
| 27 | at secondary schools, and this act is not intended to advance |
| 28 | or endorse any religion or religious belief. |
| 29 | Section 3. If any provision of this act or its |
| 30 | application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the |
