13	provisions concerning appointment and oversight
14	of the executive director of the commission;
15	exempting the commission's executive director
16	and employees of the commission from certain
17	requirements concerning state employment;
18	providing an appropriation; providing an
19	effective date.
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21	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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23	Section 1. Subsections (3), (4), and (5) of section
24	163.3247, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
25	163.3247 Century Commission for a Sustainable
26	Florida
27	(3) CENTURY COMMISSION FOR A SUSTAINABLE FLORIDA;
28	CREATION; ORGANIZATION The Century Commission for a
29	Sustainable Florida is created as a standing body to help the
30	citizens of this state envision and plan their collective
31	future with an eye towards both 25-year and 50-year horizons.

1	(a) The commission shall consist of $\underline{18}$ $\underline{15}$ members, $\underline{6}$ $\underline{5}$
2	appointed by the Governor, $\underline{6}$ $\underline{5}$ appointed by the President of
3	the Senate, and $\underline{6}$ $\underline{5}$ appointed by the Speaker of the House of
4	Representatives. Appointments shall be made no later than
5	October 1, 2005. The membership must represent local
6	governments, school boards, developers and homebuilders, the
7	business community, the agriculture community, the
8	environmental community, and other appropriate stakeholders.
9	In making the appointments, the Governor, the President of the
10	Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
11	ensure that the membership of the commission reflects the
12	racial, ethnic, and gender diversity, as well as the
13	geographic distribution, of the state's population. One member
14	shall be designated by the Governor as chair of the
15	commission. Any vacancy that occurs on the commission must be
16	filled in the same manner as the original appointment and
17	shall be for the unexpired term of that commission seat.
18	Members shall be appointed to serve 4-year terms, except that,
19	initially, to provide for staggered terms, the Governor, the
20	President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
21	Representatives shall each appoint one member to serve a
22	2 year term, two members to serve 3 year terms, and two
23	members to serve 4 year terms. All subsequent appointments
24	shall be for 4 year terms. An appointee may not serve more
25	than 6 years.
26	(b) The first meeting of the commission shall be held
27	no later than December 1, 2005, and shall meet at the call of
28	the chair but not less frequently than three times per year in
29	different regions of the state to solicit input from the
30	public or any other individuals offering testimony relevant to

31 the issues to be considered.

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- (c) Each member of the commission is entitled to one vote, and actions of the commission are not binding unless taken by a three-fifths vote of the members present. A majority of the members is required to constitute a quorum, and the affirmative vote of a quorum is required for a binding vote.
- (d) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but <u>are shall be</u> entitled to receive per diem and travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061 while in performance of their duties.
- (e) A member of the commission may not, in the period commencing with his or her appointment to the commission and continuing for 2 years after termination of such appointment, have an interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or other benefit granted or awarded by the commission.
 - (4) POWERS AND DUTIES. -- The commission shall:
- (a) Annually Conduct a process through which the commission envisions the future for the state and then develops and recommends policies, plans, action steps, or strategies to assist in achieving the vision.
- (b) Continuously review and consider statutory and regulatory provisions, governmental processes, and societal and economic trends in its inquiry of how state, regional, and local governments and entities and citizens of this state can best accommodate projected increased populations while maintaining the natural, historical, cultural, and manmade life qualities that best represent the state.
- (c) Bring together people representing varied interests to develop a shared image of the state and its developed and natural areas. The process should involve exploring the impact of the estimated population increase and

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other emerging trends and issues; creating a vision for the future; and developing a strategic action plan to achieve that vision using 25-year and 50-year intermediate planning timeframes.

- (d) Focus on essential state interests, defined as those interests that transcend local or regional boundaries and are most appropriately conserved, protected, and promoted at the state level.
- (e) Serve as an objective, nonpartisan repository of exemplary community-building ideas and as a source to recommend strategies and practices to assist others in working collaboratively to problem solve on issues relating to growth management.
- (f) Annually, on beginning January 16, 2007, and every year thereafter on the same date, provide to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a written report containing specific recommendations for addressing growth management in the state, including executive and legislative recommendations. Further, the report must shall contain discussions regarding the need for intergovernmental cooperation and the balancing of environmental protection and future development and recommendations on issues, including, but not limited to, recommendations regarding dedicated sources of funding for sewer facilities, water supply and quality, transportation facilities that are not adequately addressed by the Strategic Intermodal System, and educational infrastructure to support existing development and projected population growth.
- (q) Create and dissolve advisory committees or similar organizations as necessary in order to carry out the mission of the commission.

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(h) Receive and accept contributions from any source, 2 which shall be used to further the mission of the commission. 3 (i) Prepare and submit a budget under chapter 216. 4 (g) 5 Beginning with the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature, 7 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 8 Representatives shall create a joint select committee, the task of which shall be to review the findings and 9 10 recommendations of the Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida for potential action. 11 12 (5) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; STAFF AND OTHER ASSISTANCE.--(a) The commission shall appoint an executive director 13 who shall serve under the direction, supervision, and control 14 of the commission. The commission shall have complete 15 authority for fixing the salary of the executive director. The 16 17 commission is assigned to the Executive Office of the Governor 18 for purposes of administration and fiscal accountability, but 19 the commission shall otherwise function independently of the control and direction of the Governor. The executive director, 2.0 21 with the consent of the commission and within budgetary limitations, shall employ staff as necessary to adequately 2.2 23 perform the functions of the commission. Each employee of the commission, including the executive director, is exempt from 2.4 chapter 110 and serves at the pleasure of the commission. The 2.5 26 Secretary of Community Affairs shall select an executive 27 director of the commission, and the executive director shall 2.8 serve at the pleasure of the secretary under the supervision 29 and control of the commission. 30

1	(b) The Department of Community Affairs shall provide
2	staff and other resources necessary to accomplish the goals of
3	the commission based upon recommendations of the Governor .
4	(c) All agencies under the control of the Governor are
5	directed, and all other agencies are requested, to render
6	assistance to, and cooperate with, the commission.
7	Section 2. The three additional appointments to the
8	Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida required by
9	section 1 of this act shall be made by October 1, 2007.
10	Section 3. The sum of \$550,000 in recurring funds is
11	appropriated from the Grants and Donations Trust Fund in the
12	Department of Community Affairs to the Century Commission for
13	a Sustainable Florida for the purpose of paying salaries and
14	other administrative expenses of the commission which are
15	necessary to carry out the provisions of s. 163.3247, Florida
16	Statutes, during the 2007-2008 fiscal year.
17	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
