Subsection (61) is added to section 19 320.08058, Florida Statutes, to read: 20 21 320.08058 Specialty license plates.--22 (61) VETERANS SERVICE ORGANIZATION LICENSE PLATES. --23 (a) Notwithstanding s. 320.08053, the department shall develop a series of veterans service organization license 2.4 plates as provided in this section. Veterans Service 25 Organization license plates must bear the colors and design 26 27 approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at 2.8 the top of the plate, and the name of the respective veterans service organization must appear at the bottom of the plate. 29 The appropriate emblem for the particular veterans service 30 organization must appear on the left side of the plate and be

2	Organization license plate shall be developed for the
3	following:
4	1. The American Legion.
5	2. The Disabled American Veterans.
6	3. The Veterans of Foreign Wars.

10	(b) The department shall retain all revenues from the
11	sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and
12	issuing the plates have been recovered. Thereafter, 60 percent
13	of the annual use fees shall be remitted to the appropriate
14	organization to support its veterans and military activities,
15	programs, and projects within the state. The remaining 40
16	percent shall be deposited into the State Homes for Veterans
17	Trust Fund and used solely to construct, operate, and maintain
18	domiciliary and nursing homes for veterans subject to the
19	requirements of chapter 216.
20	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
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
