2 An act relating to motor vehicle insurance for foster 3 children; creating a pilot program to reimburse foster parents, residential facilities, or foster children who 4 5 live independently a portion of the increased costs of motor vehicle insurance for a foster child who has a 6 7 driver's license; directing the Department of Children and 8 Family Services to establish the pilot program in DeSoto, 9 Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, and Sarasota Counties; requiring that the person who incurs the 10 increased cost submit to the department documentation of 11 that increase; requiring that foster children be 12 encouraged to pay the remaining portion of the increase in 13 cost; directing the department to develop procedures for 14 operating the pilot program; requiring the department to 15 16 submit a report with recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date each year of the pilot 17 program; providing an appropriation; providing for 18 19 apportionment of the appropriation; providing an effective 20 date. 21 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 22 23 24 (1) The Legislature finds that the increased Section 1. 25 cost of motor vehicle insurance for a foster child after that 26 child obtains a driver's license is borne by the foster parents, the authorized representative of the residential facility, or 27 the foster child if living independently. 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29 cost of insurance creates an additional barrier for a foster 30 child in gaining independence and may limit the child's opportunities for obtaining employment. In accordance with these 31 32 findings, the Department of Children and Family Services shall 33 establish a 3-year pilot program in Desoto, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, and Sarasota Counties to pay a portion 34 35 of the cost of motor vehicle insurance for foster children who 36 have obtained a driver's license. 37 (2) To the extent that funding is available, the pilot program shall provide funds to pay for a portion of the increase 38 39 in the cost of motor vehicle insurance incurred by foster parents, residential facilities, and foster children living 40 independently. To be eligible for payment under the pilot 41 42 program, the person incurring the cost must submit to the department appropriate documentation demonstrating the increase 43 44 in the cost of insurance. The amount of the payment provided to 45 the foster parent, residential facility, or foster child living 46 independently shall be one-half of the amount of the increase in 47 the cost of motor vehicle insurance which is incurred as a result of adding the foster child to the policy or less than 48 49 one-half if another source of funding is available to pay for 50 the increase. The foster child must be encouraged to pay the 51 other half of the increase in insurance costs. 52 The department shall develop procedures for operating (3) the pilot program, including, but not limited to, determining 53 eligibility, providing the payment, ensuring that payment is 54 limited solely to the additional cost of including the foster 55 56 child in the insurance policy, and ensuring that the payments

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57 are made to eligible persons in the order each person is 58 determined eligible until the funds are exhausted. 59 The department shall examine and use, to the extent (4)60 possible, other available options for funding the cost of the motor vehicle insurance increase, such as, but not limited to, 61 through the child's master trust fund, social security income, 62 63 child support payments, and other income available to the child. (5) Beginning January 1, 2008, and continuing for the 64 duration of the pilot program, the department shall submit to 65 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 66 67 the House of Representatives an annual report on the success and outcomes achieved by the pilot program, with a recommendation as 68 to whether the pilot program should be continued, terminated, or 69 70 expanded. 71 Section 2. The sum of \$150,000 is appropriated from the 72 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Children and Family 73 Services for the purpose of implementing this act during the 74 2007-2008 fiscal year. This sum shall be apportioned as follows: 75 \$110,000 to be divided between Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas 76 Counties and \$40,000 to be divided among Desoto, Manatee, and 77 Sarasota Counties. 78 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.

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
