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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to emergency medical services; amending s. 401.272, F.S.; authorizing an emergency medical technician or paramedic to perform basic life support services and authorizing a paramedic to perform advanced life support services in the emergency department of a licensed hospital, regardless of whether a medical emergency exists; requiring a written agreement between the emergency medical technician's or paramedic's medical director and the hospital where such services are performed; requiring the agreement to establish the protocols, policies, and procedures under which the emergency medical technician or paramedic operates; requiring a medical director to verify and document that an emergency medical technician or paramedic performing services in an emergency department of a licensed hospital has received sufficient training and experience to perform such services; authorizing the Department of Health to adopt and enforce rules to implement provisions relating to services performed by an emergency medical technician or paramedic in the emergency department of a licensed hospital; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsections (1), (2), and (3) of section 401.272, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (5) is added to that section, to read:

401.272 Emergency medical services community health care.--

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(1) The purpose of this section is to encourage more effective <u>use utilization</u> of the skills of emergency medical technicians and paramedics by enabling them to perform, in partnership with local county health departments <u>and licensed hospitals</u>, specific additional health care tasks that are consistent with the public health and welfare.

- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary:
- (a) Paramedics or emergency medical technicians may perform health promotion and wellness activities and blood pressure screenings in a nonemergency environment, within the scope of their training, and under the direction of a medical director. As used in this paragraph, the term "health promotion and wellness" means the provision of public health programs pertaining to the prevention of illness and injury.
- (b) Paramedics may administer immunizations in a nonemergency environment, within the scope of their training, and under the direction of a medical director. There must be a written agreement between the paramedic's medical director and the county health department located in each county in which the paramedic administers immunizations. This agreement must establish the protocols, policies, and procedures under which the paramedic must operate.
- (c) An emergency medical technician or paramedic may perform, in the emergency department of a licensed hospital, basic life support services, regardless of whether a patient is experiencing a medical emergency. A written agreement must exist between the emergency medical technician's or paramedic's medical director and the licensed hospital where such services are

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performed. The agreement must establish the protocols, policies, and procedures under which the emergency medical technician or paramedic is required to operate.

- (d) A paramedic may perform, in the emergency department of a licensed hospital, advanced life support services, regardless of whether a patient is experiencing a medical emergency. A written agreement must exist between the paramedic's medical director and the hospital where such services are performed. The agreement must establish the protocols, policies, and procedures under which the paramedic is required to operate.
- (3) Each medical director under whose direction a paramedic administers immunizations or under whose direction an emergency medical technician or paramedic performs services in the emergency department of a licensed hospital must verify and document that the emergency medical technician or paramedic has received sufficient training and experience to perform such services administer immunizations. The verification must be documented on forms developed by the department, and the completed forms must be maintained at the service location of the licensee and made available to the department upon request.
- (5) The department may adopt and enforce all rules necessary to enforce the provisions relating to an emergency medical technician's or paramedic's services in the emergency department of a licensed hospital.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
