A bill to be entitled

An act relating to postsecondary education; creating s. 1009.893, F.S.; creating the Workforce Education Grant Program within the Department of Education; providing legislative intent with respect to workforce education; prescribing eligibility criteria for students to receive grants under the program; defining the term "eligible nonpublic institution of higher education"; providing that students who are eligible for certain other grant programs are not eligible for the Workforce Education Grant Program; directing the State Board of Education to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1009.893, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.893 Workforce Education Grant Program --

(1) The Legislature finds that workforce education programs are a critical component of the state's educational system and that it is in the state's interest to promote student choice, the responsiveness of postsecondary institutions to students' needs, and the relevance of educational programs to the state's economic development needs across all sectors of the state's postsecondary education system. The Legislature further finds that nonpublic institutions eligible to participate in the Workforce Education Grant Program are an integral part of the higher education system in this state and that the Workforce Education Grant Program will help meet the state's interests in regard to workforce education

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and promote consistency in its support of workforce education.

The Legislature intends to create a grant program that is not based on a student's financial need or other criteria upon which financial aid programs are based, but is a tuition assistance program for state residents.

- (2) There is created the Workforce Education Grant Program, or WEG Program, to be administered by the Department of Education.
- (3) Subject to legislative appropriation, the department shall issue a grant under the WEG Program to any student who:
- (a) Meets the residency requirement provided in s. 1009.40; and
- (b) Is enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student in a program at a campus in this state of an eligible nonpublic institution of higher education and is seeking an associate or higher degree leading to employment in occupations that are consistent with the workforce needs of employers and economic development strategies listed on the Agency for Workforce Innovation's Florida Statewide Targeted Occupations List or on a regional targeted occupations list of a regional workforce board at the time of enrollment.
- (4) As used in this section, the term "eligible nonpublic institution of higher education" means an institution:
- (a) That is licensed by the Commission for Independent Education under chapter 1005.
- (b) That is accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Secretary of Education as a reliable authority as to the quality of education or training offered at its accredited institutions.

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(c) That meets performance requirements for student achievement which include minimum objective quantitative standards, including completion rates and placement rates, established by its recognized accrediting agency set forth in paragraph (b) or by the Commission for Independent Education.

- (5) Students who are eligible to participate in the Access to Better Learning and Education Grant Program or the William L. Boyd, IV, Florida Resident Access Grant Program are not eligible to participate in this program.
- - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
