Effective January 1, 2010, paragraph (a) of 20 21 subsection (1) and paragraphs (b) and (d) of subsection (2) of 22 section 316.613, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 23 316.613 Child restraint requirements.--24 (1) (a) Each Every operator of a motor vehicle as defined 25 herein, while transporting a child in a motor vehicle operated on 26 the roadways, streets, or highways of this state, shall, if the 27 child is 7  $\frac{1}{2}$  years of age or younger, provide for protection of the child by properly using a crash-tested, federally approved 28 child restraint device that is appropriate for the height and 29 weight of the child. Such devices may include a vehicle 30 manufacturer's integrated child seat, a separate child safety 31 32 seat, or a child booster seat that displays the child's weight 33 and height specifications for the seat on the attached 34 manufacturer's label as required by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards FMVSS213. The device must comply with standards of the 35 36 United States Department of Transportation and be secured in the 37 vehicle in accordance with instructions of the manufacturer. For 38 children aged through 3 years, such restraint device must be a 39 separate carrier or a vehicle manufacturer's integrated child 40 seat. For children aged 4 through 7  $\frac{5}{5}$  years, a separate carrier, an integrated child seat, or a child booster seat belt may be 41 42 used. The court shall dismiss the charge against a motor vehicle 43 operator for a first violation of this paragraph upon proof of 44 purchase of a federally approved child restraint device.

45 (2) As used in this section, the term "motor vehicle" means46 a motor vehicle as defined in s. 316.003 that is operated on the
