I. Summary:

This bill implements the Special Appropriations Act, Senate Proposed Committee Bill 7064, by adopting by reference the document filed with the Secretary of the Senate, entitled "Public School Funding – The Florida Education Finance Program," dated March _ , 2008. This document contains the revised third calculation of the Florida Education Finance Program for the 2007-2008 fiscal year. The bill also provides legislative intent that any reductions in expenditures by school districts in response to the appropriation reductions in the Special Appropriations Act be made in functions other than classroom instruction.

This bill does not amend, create, or repeal any section of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

The current calculation of the Florida Education Finance Program is the third calculation, dated December 19, 2007, and revised January 2, 2008. This calculation does not include the changes in appropriations made in Senate Proposed Committee Bill 7064.

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III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1 of this bill implements Specific Appropriations 2 and 29 through 32 of the Special Appropriations Act, Senate Proposed Committee Bill 7064, by adopting by reference the document "Public School Funding –The Florida Education Finance Program" dated March _ , 2008. This document contains the revised third calculation of the Florida Education Finance Program which displays the calculations used by the Legislature, consistent with requirements of the Florida Statutes, in making appropriations and reductions in appropriations for the Florida Education Finance Program for the 2007-2008 fiscal year.

Section 2 provides legislative intent that any reductions in expenditures as a result of the reductions in appropriations in Specific Appropriations 2 and 29 through 32 of the Special Appropriations Act, Senate Proposed Committee Bill 7064, be made in functions other than classroom instruction.
