15	Section 1. Subsections (4) and (6) of section 1012.56,
16	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

18	(4) MASTERY OF SUBJECT AREA KNOWLEDGEAcceptable means
19	of demonstrating mastery of subject area knowledge are:
20	(a) Achievement of passing scores on subject area

23	Farsi, French, German, Greek, Haitian Creole, Hebrew, Hindi,

(c) (b) Completion of the subject area specialization 31 requirements specified in state board rule and verification of 32 the attainment of the essential subject matter competencies by 33 the district school superintendent of the employing school 34 35 district or chief administrative officer of the employing statesupported or private school for a subject area for which a 36 37 subject area examination has not been developed and required by state board rule; 38

39 <u>(d) (c)</u> Completion of the subject area specialization 40 requirements specified in state board rule for a subject 41 coverage requiring a master's or higher degree and achievement 42 of a passing score on the subject area examination specified in 43 state board rule;

44 (e) (d) A valid professional standard teaching certificate
45 issued by another state; or

46 <u>(f)(e)</u> A valid certificate issued by the National Board 47 for Professional Teaching Standards or a national educator 48 credentialing board approved by the State Board of Education. 49

50 School districts are encouraged to provide mechanisms for those 51 middle school teachers holding only a K-6 teaching certificate 52 to obtain a subject area coverage for middle grades through 53 postsecondary coursework or district add-on certification.

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(6) TYPES AND TERMS OF CERTIFICATION. --

(a) The Department of Education shall issue a professional
certificate for a period not to exceed 5 years to any applicant
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who meets all the requirements outlined in subsection (2). 57 58 (b) The department shall issue a temporary certificate to 59 any applicant who completes the requirements outlined in 60 paragraphs (2)(a)-(f) and completes the subject area content 61 requirements specified in state board rule or demonstrates mastery of subject area knowledge pursuant to subsection (4) and 62 63 holds an accredited degree or a degree approved by the Department of Education at the level required for the subject 64 65 area specialization in state board rule.

(c) The department shall issue one nonrenewable 2-year temporary certificate and one nonrenewable 5-year professional certificate to a qualified applicant who holds a bachelor's degree in the area of speech-language impairment to allow for completion of a master's degree program in speech-language impairment.

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Each temporary certificate is valid for 3 school fiscal years 73 74 and is nonrenewable. However, the requirement in paragraph 75 (2) (g) must be met within 1 calendar year of the date of 76 employment under the temporary certificate. Individuals who are 77 employed under contract at the end of the 1 calendar year time 78 period may continue to be employed through the end of the school 79 year in which they have been contracted. A school district shall 80 not employ, or continue the employment of, an individual in a 81 position for which a temporary certificate is required beyond this time period if the individual has not met the requirement 82 of paragraph (2)(g). The State Board of Education shall adopt 83 rules to allow the department to extend the validity period of a 84 Page 3 of 4

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85 temporary certificate for 2 years when the requirements for the 86 professional certificate, not including the requirement in paragraph (2)(g), were not completed due to the serious illness 87 or injury of the applicant or other extraordinary extenuating 88 89 circumstances. The department shall reissue the temporary 90 certificate for 2 additional years upon approval by the 91 Commissioner of Education. A written request for reissuance of 92 the certificate shall be submitted by the district school 93 superintendent, the governing authority of a university lab school, the governing authority of a state-supported school, or 94 the governing authority of a private school. 95

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
