2	An act relating to criminal history record checks;
3	defining the terms "sports coach" and "independent youth
4	athletic team"; requiring any person who is a sports coach
5	of an independent youth athletic team to meet level 2
6	screening requirements as described in ch. 435, F.S.;
7	providing testing procedures; requiring each sanctioning
8	authority to sign an affidavit annually, under penalty of
9	perjury, stating that all sports coaches under its
10	jurisdiction have been screened or are newly hired and
11	awaiting the results of the required screening; requiring
12	each sports coach to pay the costs of his or her
13	screening; providing that a sports coach who willfully,
14	knowingly, or intentionally violates the act commits a
15	misdemeanor of the first degree; providing criminal
16	penalties; providing an effective date.
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18	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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20	Section 1. Criminal history record checks for sports
21	coaches
22	(1) As used in this section, the term:
23	(a) "Independent youth athletic team" or "team" means an
24	athletic team that:
25	1. Includes a minor as a team member;
26	2. Is sanctioned by an independent organization; and
27	3. Is not sanctioned by or affiliated with a public or
28	private school.
29	(b) "Minor" has the same meaning as in s. 1.01, Florida
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30	Statutes.
31	(c) "Sports coach" means a person who is authorized by a
32	sanctioning authority to be responsible for leading an
33	independent youth athletic team and any person assisting the
34	sports coach. A sports coach is an individual who:
35	1. Works or is to work for the independent youth athletic
36	team 20 or more hours within a calendar year;
37	2. Has or is to have unsupervised contact with minors; and
38	3. Serves or is to serve as a chaperone for minors on any
39	overnight activity related to the independent youth athletic
40	team.
41	(2) Any person in this state who acts as a sports coach to
42	an independent youth athletic team must meet level 2 screening
43	requirements as described in chapter 435, Florida Statutes.
44	(3) Except as otherwise provided by law, the following
45	requirements apply:
46	(a) Each sports coach who coaches an independent youth
47	athletic team must, within 5 working days after being designated
48	as a sports coach, submit to the appropriate sanctioning
49	authority a complete set of fingerprints and other information
50	necessary to conduct a screening under chapter 435, Florida
51	Statutes.
52	(b) The sanctioning authority must submit the information
53	necessary for screening to the Department of Law Enforcement
54	within 5 working days after receiving it. The Department of Law
55	Enforcement shall conduct a search of its criminal and juvenile
56	records and request that the Federal Bureau of Investigation
57	conduct a search of its records for each sports coach for whom
58	the request is made. The Department of Law Enforcement shall

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59	respond to the sanctioning authority and the sanctioning
60	authority shall inform the sports coach whether screening has
61	revealed disqualifying information.
62	(c) A sports coach whose background is being checked must
63	supply any missing criminal information or other necessary
64	information to the sanctioning authority within 30 days after the
65	sanctioning authority makes a request for the information or be
66	subject to automatic disqualification from acting as a sports
67	coach.
68	(4) Unless otherwise prohibited by state or federal law, a
69	sports coach may be placed on probationary status pending a
70	determination of compliance with minimum standards set forth in
71	this section.
72	(5) Each sanctioning authority that is required to conduct
73	level 2 background screening must sign an affidavit annually,
74	under penalty of perjury, stating that all sports coaches under
75	its jurisdiction have been screened or are newly hired and
76	awaiting the results of the required screening.
77	(6) A sports coach shall pay the costs of his or her own
78	screening. Payment shall be submitted to the Department of Law
79	Enforcement along with the request for screening.
80	(7) A sports coach who willfully, knowingly, or
81	intentionally violates this section commits a misdemeanor of the
82	first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083,
83	Florida Statutes.
84	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
