1	The Committee on Governmental Operations (King) recommended the

7	Section 1. Paragraph (h) of subsection (2) and subsection
8	(4) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, are amended,
9	paragraphs (i) and (j) are added to subsection (2) of that
10	section, and paragraph (c) is added to subsection (9) of that
11	section, to read:
12	121.0515 Special risk membership
13	(2) CRITERIAA member, to be designated as a special risk
14	member, must meet the following criteria:
15	(h) Effective October 1, 2005, through June 30, 2008, the
16	member must be employed by a law enforcement agency or medical
17	examiner's office in a forensic discipline recognized by the
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18 International Association for Identification and must qualify for active membership in the International Association for 19 20 Identification. The member's primary duties and responsibilities 21 must include the collection, examination, preservation, 22 documentation, preparation, or analysis of physical evidence or 23 testimony, or both, or the member must be the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or command officer of one or more 24 individuals with such responsibility. Administrative support 25 26 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 27 responsibilities are clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included. 28 29 (i) Effective July 1, 2008, the member must be employed by 30 the Department of Law Enforcement in the crime laboratory or by the Division of State Fire Marshal in the forensic laboratory in 31 32 one of the following classes: 1. Forensic technologist (class code 8459); 33 34 2. Crime laboratory technician (class code 8461); 35 3. Crime laboratory analyst (class code 8463); 36 4. Senior crime laboratory analyst (class code 8464); 5. Crime laboratory analyst supervisor (class code 8466); 37 6. Forensic chief (class code 9602); or 38 39 7. Forensic services quality manager (class code 9603). (j) Effective July 1, 2008, the member must be employed by 40 41 a local government law enforcement agency or medical examiner's 42 office and must spend at least 65 percent of his or her time performing duties that involve the collection, examination, 43 preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of human 44 45 tissues or fluids or physical evidence having potential 46 biological, chemical, or radiological hazard or contamination, or 47 use chemicals, processes, or materials that may have carcinogenic



48 <u>or health damaging properties in the analysis of said evidence,</u> 49 <u>or the member must be the direct supervisor of one or more</u> 50 <u>individuals having such responsibility. If a special risk member</u> 51 <u>changes to another position within the same agency, he or she</u> 52 <u>must submit a complete application as provided paragraph (3)(a).</u>

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(4) REMOVAL OF SPECIAL RISK MEMBERSHIP.--

54 Any member who is a special risk member on October 1, (a) 1978, and who fails to meet the criteria for special risk 55 56 membership established by this section shall have his or her special risk designation removed and thereafter shall be a 57 regular member and shall earn only regular membership credit. The 58 59 department shall have the authority to review the special risk 60 designation of members to determine whether or not those members continue to meet the criteria for special risk membership. 61

62 (b) Any member who is a special risk member on July 1, 2008, and who became eligible to participate under paragraph 63 64 (2) (h) but fails to meet the criteria for special risk membership established by paragraph (2)(i) or paragraph (2)(j) shall have 65 66 his or her special risk designation removed and thereafter shall be a regular member and earn only regular membership credit. The 67 department may review the special risk designation of members to 68 69 determine whether or not those members continue to meet the 70 criteria for special risk membership.

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(9) CREDIT FOR UPGRADED SERVICE.--

(c) Any member of the Special Risk Class who has earned creditable service in another membership class of the Florida Retirement System in a position with the Department of Law Enforcement or the Division of State Fire Marshal and became covered by the Special Risk Class as described in paragraph (2) (i), or with a local government law enforcement agency or



78	medical examiner's office and became covered by the Special Risk
79	Class as described in paragraph (2)(j), which service is within
80	the purview of the Special Risk Class, and is employed in such
81	position on or after July 1, 2008, may purchase additional
82	retirement credit to upgrade such service to Special Risk Class
83	service, to the extent of the percentages of the member's average
84	final compensation provided in s. 121.091(1)(a)2. The cost for
85	such credit shall be an amount representing the actuarial accrued
86	liability for the difference in accrual value during the affected
87	period of service. The cost shall be calculated using the
88	discount rate and other relevant actuarial assumptions that were
89	used to value the Florida Retirement System defined benefit plan
90	liabilities in the most recent actuarial valuation. The division
91	shall ensure that the transfer sum is prepared using a formula
92	and methodology certified by an enrolled actuary. The cost must
93	be paid immediately upon notification by the division. The local
94	government employer may purchase the upgraded service credit on
95	behalf of the member if the member has been employed by that
96	employer for at least 3 years.
97	Section 2. The Legislature finds that a proper and
98	legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees of
99	the state and its political subdivisions, and the dependents,
100	survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees, are
101	extended additional protections afforded by governmental
102	retirement systems. These persons must be provided benefits that
103	are fair and adequate and that are managed, administered, and
104	funded in a sound actuarial manner, as required by Section 14,
105	Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112,
106	Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature determines and
107	declares that this act fulfills an important state interest.

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108	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

116	s. 121.0515, F.S.; revising the criteria under which
117	certain employees of the Department of Law Enforcement,
118	the Division of State Fire Marshal, or a local government
119	law enforcement agency or medical examiner's office are
120	eligible for membership in the Special Risk Class;
121	authorizing the Department of Management Services to
122	review the special risk designation of certain members;
123	authorizing certain members to purchase additional
124	retirement credit to upgrade prior service to Special Risk
125	Class service; providing for the calculation of
126	contributions for such service upgrade; authorizing the
127	employer to purchase such additional credit for certain
128	members; providing a declaration of important state
129	interest; providing an effective date.

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
