House Resolution

A resolution recognizing March 25, 2008, as "African Methodist Episcopal Church Day" at the Capitol.

5 WHEREAS, the African Methodist Episcopal Church grew out of 6 the Free African Society, established by Richard Allen, Absalom 7 Jones, and others in 1787 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and

8 WHEREAS, facing discrimination at the hands of American 9 Methodists at the St. George Methodist Episcopal Church, members 10 of the Free African Society transformed their mutual aid society 11 into a church congregation, and

12 WHEREAS, in 1794 the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal13 Church was dedicated with Richard Allen as pastor, and

14 WHEREAS, to establish the Bethel African Methodist 15 Episcopal Church's independence from interfering white 16 Methodists, Richard Allen successfully sued in the Pennsylvania 17 courts in 1807 and 1815 for the right of his congregation to 18 exist as an independent institution, and

19 WHEREAS, with the geographical spread of the African Methodist Episcopal Church prior to the Civil War mainly 20 21 restricted to the Northeast and Midwest, the most significant era of denominational development occurred during the Civil War 22 23 and Reconstruction, when Union army officials would allow African Methodist Episcopal Church clergy to move into the 24 states of the collapsing Confederacy to pull newly freed slaves 25 into their denomination, and 26

WHEREAS, by 1880, African Methodist Episcopal Churchmembership reached 400,000 members, and

WHEREAS, Bishop Henry M. Turner pushed African Methodism
across the Atlantic Ocean into Liberia and Sierra Leone in 1891
and into South Africa in 1896, and

32 WHEREAS, while the African Methodist Episcopal Church is 33 doctrinally Methodist, clergy, scholars, and lay persons have 34 written many important works that demonstrate the distinctive 35 theology and praxis which have defined this Wesleyan body, and

WHEREAS, by the 1990s, the African Methodist Episcopal Church included over 2,000,000 members, 8,000 ministers, and 7,000 congregations, with 20 bishops and 12 general officers comprising the leadership of the denomination in more than 30 nations in North and South America, Africa, and Europe, and

WHEREAS, in Florida and the Bahamas, the African Methodist
Episcopal Church boasts over 105,000 members in the Florida,
East, Central, West Coast, South, and Bahamas Conferences, who
are currently led by Bishop McKinley Young, NOW, THEREFORE,
