Section 1. Paragraphs (a) and (f) of subsection (2) of section 14.204, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

14.204 Agency for Enterprise Information Technology. -- The

Agency for Enterprise Information Technology is created within the Executive Office of the Governor. The head of the agency shall be the Governor and Cabinet, which shall take action by majority vote consisting of at least three affirmative votes with the Governor on the prevailing side. The agency shall be a

separate budget entity that is not subject to control,

supervision, or direction by the Executive Office of the Governor in any manner, including, but not limited to, purchasing, transactions involving real or personal property, personnel, or budgetary matters.

(2) The agency shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- (a) Develop and implement strategies for the design, delivery, and management of the enterprise information technology services established in law, including, but not limited to, strategies for providing information on the state Internet portal in English and Spanish, at a minimum, by October 1, 2010, and strategies and timeframes for phasing in the deployment of information on all state agency government websites in English and Spanish, at a minimum.
- (f) Develop and publish a strategic enterprise information technology plan that identifies and recommends strategies for how enterprise information technology will deliver effective and efficient government services to state residents and improve the operations of state agencies, including, but not limited to, strategies, timeframes, and required funding for implementing the deployment of information to businesses and individuals in English and Spanish, at a minimum, as described in paragraph (a).
- Section 2. Subsections (9) through (14) of section 282.102, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (10) through (15), respectively, and a new subsection (9) is added to that section to read:

282.102 Powers and duties.--The Department of Management Services shall have the following powers, duties, and functions:

- (9) Contingent upon funding, the department shall maintain the state Internet portal that is the primary single website designed to provide general information about state government and electronically redirect inquiries to other state government websites and shall, no later than October 1, 2010, deploy the information on the portal in English and Spanish, at a minimum.
- Section 3. Section 282.1025, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 282.1025 Deploying government products, services, and information on state government website; agency requirements.--Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, no later than October 1, 2015, an agency deploying information to individuals and businesses on a state government website shall provide the information in English and Spanish, at a minimum.

Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2008.
