reasonable efforts have been made to prevent access
through other means; providing for future review and
repeal of the exemption under the Open Government
Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public
necessity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 119.071, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

119.071 General exemptions from inspection or copying of public records.—

- (4) AGENCY PERSONNEL INFORMATION. -
- (d)1.a. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or former law enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, and

personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of justices and judges are exempt from s. 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any local government agency or water management district whose duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.
- 3. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

An agency that is the custodian of the personal information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., subparagraph 6., ex subparagraph 7., or subparagraph 8. and that is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., subparagraph 3., subparagraph 4., subparagraph 5., subparagraph 6., ex subparagraph 7., or subparagraph 8. shall maintain the exempt status of the personal information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing agency of the designated employee submits a written request for maintenance of the exemption to the custodial agency.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of current or former investigators and inspectors of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended

by the children of such personnel be made exempt from public-2.04 205 records requirements. This exemption is justified because, if 206 this information were not made exempt from public-records 207 requirements, the investigators, inspectors, or the family 208 members of these investigators or inspectors could be harmed or 209 threatened with harm by a current or former litigant or a person 210 under investigation by the Department of Business and 211 Professional Regulation. Department of Business and Professional 212 Regulation investigators and inspectors perform an important 213 regulatory function, which may result in the investigators and 214 inspectors entering places of business or residences of victims, 215 witnesses, licensees, or other individuals who are under investigation by the agency. In many instances, the individuals 216 217 under investigation risk possible sanctions, including the loss 218 of their livelihood. As a result, the individuals are not always 219 willing participants in the investigation and have retaliated 220 against the investigators and inspectors. The Department of 221 Business and Professional Regulation has documented reports of 222 intimidation, threats of violence, and other abuse. The 223 investigators and inspectors have reported incidents where they 224 were both threatened on the job and at their personal 225 residences. Therefore, the harm that <u>might result from the</u> 226 release of the information outweighs any public benefit that 227 could be derived from disclosure of the information. 228 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
