A bill to be entitled

An act relating to public K-12 educational instruction; amending s. 1003.46, F.S., relating to health education; deleting provisions that require schools to teach abstinence from sexual activity outside of marriage as the expected standard for all school-age students as part of instruction in human sexuality; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Subsection (2) of section 1003.46, Florida Section 1. Statutes, is amended to read:

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1003.46 Health education; instruction in acquired immune deficiency syndrome. --

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Throughout instruction in acquired immune deficiency syndrome, sexually transmitted diseases, or health education, when such instruction and course material contains instruction in human sexuality, a school shall:

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(a) Teach abstinence from sexual activity outside of marriage as the expected standard for all school-age students while teaching the benefits of monogamous heterosexual marriage.

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(a) (b) Emphasize that abstinence from sexual activity is a certain way to avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, including acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and other associated health problems.

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(b)(c) Teach that each student has the power to control personal behavior and encourage students to base actions on reasoning, self-esteem, and respect for others.

 $\underline{\text{(c)}}$ Provide instruction and material that is appropriate for the grade and age of the student.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
