Section 1. Section 125.01045, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

125.01045 Prohibition of collection of fees for firstresponder services.-

(1) As residents are currently taxed or assessed for essential government services, a county may not seek reimbursement from a resident of that county for any costs or expenses that may be incurred for services provided by a first 13

responder, including costs or expenses related to personnel, supplies, motor vehicles, or equipment in response to a motor vehicle accident, except for costs of materials to contain or clean up hazardous materials in quantities reportable to the Florida State Warning Point at the Division of Emergency Management, and costs for transportation and treatment provided by ambulance services licensed pursuant to s. 401.23(5).

(2) As used in this section, the term "first responder" means a law enforcement officer as defined in s. 943.10, a firefighter as defined in s. 633.30, or an emergency medical technician or paramedic as defined in s. 401.23 who is employed by the state or a local government. A volunteer law enforcement officer, firefighter, or emergency medical technician or paramedic engaged by the state or a local government is also considered a first responder of the state or local government for purposes of this section.

Section 2. Section 166.0446, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

166.0446 Prohibition of collection of fees for firstresponder services.-

(1) As residents are currently taxed or assessed for essential government services, a municipality may not seek reimbursement for any costs or expenses that may be incurred for services provided by a first responder, including costs or expenses related to personnel, supplies, motor vehicles, or equipment in response to a motor vehicle accident, except for transportation and treatment provided by ambulance services licensed pursuant to s. 401.23(5) or for costs of materials to contain or clean up hazardous materials in quantities reportable 42
