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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to renewable energy and technologies; creating s. 377.809, F.S.; authorizing the Florida Energy and Climate Commission to create the Go Green Florida Program to issue monetary grants and recognition awards recognizing innovative local and statewide efforts to reduce energy consumption, raise awareness of alternative energy-efficient practices, reward efforts that encourage alternative energy use, and reduce the carbon footprint of this state; authorizing the commission to use certain funds for specified objectives; requiring the commission to establish an advisory panel; providing for membership on the advisory panel; providing that nongovernmental members of the advisory panel are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties; requiring the advisory panel to prepare recommendations for the Florida Energy and Climate Commission regarding grants and recognition awards; requiring the commission to create criteria for grants and recognition awards; providing for the requirements of the criteria; authorizing the commission to coordinate its other programs with the Go Green Florida Program; authorizing the commission to request assistance coordinating the activities and implementations of the Go Green Florida Program from the Volunteer Florida Foundation; requiring the commission to adopt rules; amending ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058, F.S.; creating

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the Go Green Florida license plate; establishing an annual fee for the plate; providing for the distribution of use fees received from the annual sale of such plates; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 377.809, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 377.809 Go Green Florida Grants and Awards Program.—
 (1) This section may be cited as the "Go Green Florida Program."
- 4.3 to create the Go Green Florida Grants and Awards Program. The 44 program includes monetary grants and recognition awards to 45 provide incentives for and recognition to students, schools, 46 members of the public, community organizations, not-for-profit 47 organizations, businesses, and local governments that recognize 48 innovative local and statewide efforts to reduce energy 49 consumption, raise awareness of alternative energy-efficient 50 practices, reward efforts that encourage alternative energy use, 51 and reduce the carbon footprint in this state. The commission 52 shall ensure that the Go Green Florida Program is integrated
 - (3) The commission may use funds received from the annual proceeds of the Go Green Florida specialty license plate and from funds specifically appropriated for this program to award grants to assist persons and entities to develop and implement

with other efforts to reduce energy consumption and climate

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innovative programs and projects that educate and inform the residents of this state on how to achieve green standards and how to engage in responsible energy-efficient practices. The commission may fund cost-efficient programs and innovative solutions to energy usage and environmental protection which reduce greenhouse gas emissions, encourage the use of alternative energy sources, improve the quality of life, and strengthen the economy of this state.

- (4) (a) The commission shall appoint a Go Green Florida advisory panel that will assist the commission in selecting programs and initiatives for monetary grants or recognition awards. The appointment of the panel members shall be made by October 1, 2009.
- (b) The advisory panel consists of nine members, appointed to terms that do not exceed 4 years. The advisory panel must include two members of the Coalition for Renewable Energy Solutions, Inc., one member of the commission, and six members of the public who are involved in promoting responsible energy-efficient practices. The six public members shall be appointed as follows:
 - 1. Two members by the Governor.
 - 2. Two members by the President of the Senate.
- $\underline{\mbox{3. Two members by the Speaker of the House of}}$ Representatives.
- (c) The purpose of the advisory panel is to submit to the commission, for approval, recommendations for monetary grants and recognition awards for innovative programs and objectives.
- (d) Members of the panel do not receive any compensation for their services, but nongovernmental members are entitled to

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receive reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as provided in s. 112.061.

- (5) The commission may approve monetary grants and issue recognition awards to recognize individuals and groups for innovative programs and objectives. By rule, the commission shall create the criteria for selecting worthy projects for funding or recognition. The criteria shall:
- (a) Identify funding categories, limits, funding amounts, and evaluation of projects that may be eligible for funding, and standards and categories for the recognition awards.
- (b) Require that projects receiving funding or recognition awards accomplish the goals of achieving green standards, reducing energy consumption and the carbon footprint of the state, raising awareness of alternative energy-efficient practices, and encouraging alternative energy use. Priority for funding shall be given to programs that can be shared and replicated with other organizations and communities throughout the state.
- (c) Determine if grant recipients are required to provide funds to match some portion of state funds by direct project cost-sharing or in-kind services.
- (d) Allow for the creation of a Go Green Florida Program emblem, decal, or logo that the commission and Governor may use to recognize individual or community efforts and achievements that accomplish the goals of the Go Green Florida Program.
- (e) Require grant applications and award recommendations to be submitted on appropriate forms that are developed and adopted by the commission, along with appropriate supporting documentation.

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(f) Establish a system to determine the relative priority for choosing particular projects from among the many grant applications received. The priority system must consider factors such as greenhouse gas reductions, energy savings and efficiencies, alternative energy usage, proven technologies, the educational effect of the project, and the project's possible replication throughout the state.

- (g) Provide for the termination of grants when program requirements are not being met.
- (h) Provide for disseminating information concerning successful innovative programs and projects throughout the state through electronic and conventional channels or other means of informing the public.
- (6) The commission shall ensure that the Go Green Florida Program is coordinated, to the extent necessary, with the other programs and grants programs it operates.
- (7) The commission may request assistance in coordinating the activities and implementation of this program from the Volunteer Florida Foundation.
- (8) The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 120 to administer the monetary grants and recognition awards program.
- Section 2. Paragraph (qqq) is added to subsection (4) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, to read:
 - 320.08056 Specialty license plates.-
- (4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be collected for the appropriate specialty license plates:
- (qqq) Go Green Florida license plate, \$25, except that for alternative fuel vehicles and electric vehicles, the annual use

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fee shall be \$20 per plate; and for fleet vehicles, \$10 per plate.

Section 3. Subsection (69) is added to section 320.08058, Florida Statutes, to read:

- 320.08058 Specialty license plates.-
- (69) GO GREEN FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.—
- (a) The department shall develop a Go Green Florida license plate as provided in this section. The Go Green Florida license plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Go Green Florida" must appear at the bottom of the plate. The Go Green Florida emblem or logo must appear on the plate.
- (b) The Go Green Florida license plate must be made available at a reduced fee for fleet license plates, government license plates, and electric vehicle and alternative fuel vehicle license plates.
- (c) The Go Green Florida emblem may be authorized for use by the department in recognition of energy-efficient vehicle usage and practices. The display of the decal for energy-efficient practices is not a substitute for a legal license tag.
- (d) The requirements of s. 320.08053 must be met before the issuance of the specialty license plate.
- (e) The proceeds from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Coalition for Renewable Energy Solutions,

 Inc., a not-for-profit corporation. The Coalition for Renewable Energy Solutions shall retain the first \$60,000 in proceeds from the annual use fees as reimbursement for administrative costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the approval process.

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Thereafter, up to 25 percent shall be used for continuing
promotion and marketing of the license plate and concept. The
remaining funds shall be used in the following manner:

- 1. Five percent of the proceeds shall be used by the coalition for administrative costs directly associated with the operations as they relate to the management and distribution of the proceeds.
- 2. The remainder of the proceeds shall be distributed for Go Green Florida grants, as approved by the Florida Energy and Climate Commission, to promote the goals and objectives set forth in s. 377.809. In addition, funds may be spent to defray costs associated with recognition awards approved by the Florida Energy and Climate Commission.

The coalition shall submit financial statements on all expenditures related to the grants and awards program to the Office of the Auditor General each year within 60 days after the close of the coalition's fiscal year.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
