WHEREAS, Randy attended the University of Florida, earning a degree in Journalism and Communications, was a member of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society and the Pi Kappa Phi fraternity and, as he often said, "loved him some Gators," and

WHEREAS, Randy met his wife, Sara Rust Roberts, while serving as a volunteer at Best Buddies, a nonprofit organization that serves Florida's students, and

WHEREAS, Randy and Sara built a loving marriage spanning 9 years and producing two beautiful children, Charlotte and Samuel, and

WHEREAS, Randy was a tireless leader in the state's political process, recruiting, training, and supporting hundreds of candidates at the local, state, and federal levels, and

WHEREAS, Randy was a passionate advocate for the state's business community, promoting policies and programs to generate jobs, encourage innovation, and stimulate growth, and

WHEREAS, Randy served with distinction as the director of government relations for Publix Super Markets, the largest
