An act relating to possession of stolen credit cards; amending s. 817.60, F.S.; prohibiting possession of a credit card by a person who knows or who should know that it is stolen; providing criminal penalties; providing enhanced penalties for second or subsequent violations; amending s. 817.67, F.S.; providing that persons subject to a specified penalty provision are guilty of a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in specified provisions; amending s. 921.0022, F.S.; conforming a cross-reference to changes made by this act; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (6) and (7) of section 817.60, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (7) and (8), respectively, and a new subsection (6) is added to that section to read:

817.60 Theft; obtaining credit card through fraudulent means.--

(6) POSSESSION OF A STOLEN CREDIT CARD.--

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), a person who knowingly has in his or her possession a credit card that he or she knows or should know was stolen violates this subsection and is subject to the penalties set forth in s. 817.67(2).
