and insert:

automatic <u>landscape irrigation</u> <del>lawn sprinkler</del> system after May 1, 1991, shall <u>properly</u> install, and <u>must</u> maintain, and operate <u>technology</u>, a rain sensor device or switch that <u>inhibits</u> <u>or interrupts operation of</u> will override the <u>irrigation cycle of</u> <u>the sprinkler</u> system <u>during periods of sufficient moisture</u> when adequate rainfall has occurred.

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(2) A licensed contractor who performs work on an automatic
