The Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs (Storms) recommended the following:

Senate Amendment

Delete lines 41 - 85

and insert:

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establish an Autism Services Grant Council whose membership shall be drawn from among stakeholders throughout the state who represent the interests of individuals with autism and related disabilities. The grant council shall provide grants from available Autism license plate proceeds to nonprofit organizations throughout the state to establish or operate direct services and programs for individuals with autism and

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related disabilities and their families or to market the Autism license plate. Consideration for participation in such services and programs shall be given to applicants who are children or adults with autism and related disabilities and their families and shall include those who are on the Agency for Persons with Disabilities waiting lists for services. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., shall also establish an Autism License Plate Fund. Moneys in the fund shall be used by the grant council as provided in this paragraph. All funds received under this subsection must be used in this state.

- (c) Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., may retain all proceeds from the annual use fee up to \$85,000 until all documented startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered. Thereafter, the proceeds from the annual use fee shall be used as follows:
- 1. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee for all administrative costs associated with the operation of the Autism Services Grant Council, the Autism License Plate Fund, and the programs established and operated as provided in subparagraph 2., including the costs of an annual audit or compliance affidavit.
- 2. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., may use up to twenty-five percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee to establish and operate programs statewide to support individuals with autism and related disabilities and their families through direct services, evaluation, and training.
- 3. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., shall disburse fifteen percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee



to The Center for Autism and Related Disabilities at the University of Miami, for distribution to the seven regional autism centers created under s. 1004.55. To the extent possible, the director of The Center for Autism and Related Disabilities at the University of Miami shall distribute funds proportionately among the regional centers. The regional centers shall use the funds to support the services they provide.

4. Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., shall disburse fifty percent of the proceeds from the annual use fee to the Autism Services Grant Council which shall provide grants to nonprofit organizations throughout the state to establish or operate direct services and programs for individuals with autism and related disabilities and their families or to market the Autism license plate.

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> All grant recipients, the Achievement and Rehabilitation Centers, Inc., and the Center for Autism and Related Disabilities at the University of Miami, shall provide to the Autism Services Grant Council an annual program and financial report regarding the use of the proceeds from the annual use fee. The report shall be made available to the public.
