House Resolution

A resolution honoring Governor LeRoy Collins, the 33rd Governor of the State of Florida, on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of his birth.

WHEREAS, Governor Thomas LeRoy Collins, a native son of Florida, was born in the capital city of Tallahassee, Florida, on March 10, 1909, and, to this day, Governor Collins continues to be regarded as one of the foremost statesmen and beloved governors in Florida history, and

WHEREAS, 2009 marks the centennial anniversary of the birth of LeRoy Collins, considered by many to be "the greatest Floridian," and

WHEREAS, from 1955 to 1961, LeRoy Collins served as the 33rd Governor of Florida, leading the state with courage and foresight through the tumultuous civil rights era, and

WHEREAS, while guiding the state through a period of unparalleled historic social and cultural change, Governor Collins also implemented a comprehensive vision for the growth and development of Florida and a foundation for strong, principled state government that transformed Florida's role in the nation to that of a modern leadership state, a role that continues into the 21st Century, and

WHEREAS, LeRoy Collins has continued to influence Floridians for decades and continues to be recognized and honored for his lifetime of achievements by historians, citizens, and elected officials, and

WHEREAS, most notable among the many lasting tributes to Governor Collins is his designation as "Floridian of the Century" in 1991 by the Florida Legislature, where he served in both the Florida House of Representatives and the Florida Senate before becoming Governor, and

WHEREAS, the naming of the LeRoy Collins Leon County Public Library and the Steele-Collins Charter School in his honor were recognitions of his visionary leadership in the field of education, as are a multitude of community college and university programs, projects, and initiatives that have been established in his name over the decades since his term as Governor, and

WHEREAS, in recognition of Governor Collins' efforts toward the advancement of participatory democracy, "Florida Citizenship and Leadership Day," also known as "Democracy and Governor Collins Day," was designated and observed in the year 2000 on Governor Collins' birthday, and

WHEREAS, for decades, Governor Collins has been heralded as the originator of Florida's renowned "government in the sunshine" or "open government" concept, a concept of state government for which Florida remains the standard throughout the nation, and

WHEREAS, as a staunch advocate and faultless practitioner of principled and ethical governance, Governor Collins stood unwaveringly on principle and decency and avoided taking the road of political expediency always, and, as a consequence, his reputation stands unblemished to this day and remains a standard for elected officials everywhere, and

WHEREAS, among the other causes and issues Governor Collins championed and advanced were an unwavering devotion to civil rights, human rights, and the rule of law; the advancement of race relations and equal opportunity and equal protection for all; increased funding for education; the revision and modernization of the Florida Constitution; the founding of the community college system; the creation and development of Florida's transportation and turnpike systems; the development of Florida's state parks system; the conscientious stewardship of the state's environment and natural resources; the diversification of the state's economy; apportionment and redistricting of the state in the interest of fairness to voters; the confronting of death penalty issues; the banning of cigarette advertisements on television; the provision of compassionate care to persons with disabilities; the advocacy of a merit system for public employees; the creation of the University of South Florida and Florida Atlantic University; the initiation of the annual football game between the University of Florida and Florida State University; prominent display and increased use of the state flag; and many other causes, projects, and issues that formed a comprehensive vision for the improvement of the lives of all Floridians and the government of the state, and

WHEREAS, Governor LeRoy Collins is widely regarded as one of the finest and most effective public servants in Florida history and a transformational and visionary governor, and

WHEREAS, Governor Collins' many state and national contributions, along with his leadership abilities, sense of

personal courage, and strict adherence to ethical dealings, serve as an ongoing source of inspiration not only to younger citizens but to community leaders and elected officials who are engaged in service to, and strive for the greater good of, their communities and the state, and

WHEREAS, the spirit with which Governor Collins carried out the duties of his office and the legacy he left to the state serve to personally remind us all of what the true nature of a public servant should be and that each one of us can have a positive effect on the lives of others, and

WHEREAS, Governor LeRoy Collins' faith and family sustained him during a lifetime of great achievement, and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Mary Call Darby Collins, Governor Collins' beloved wife, the great granddaughter of territorial Governor Richard Keith Call, and the four Collins children, daughters Jane, Mary Call, and Darby, and son, LeRoy, Jr., are also to be recognized for their many contributions and public service, both individually and as a family, to the State of Florida, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives of the State of Florida recognizes and honors Governor LeRoy Collins, 33rd Governor of the State of Florida and "Floridian of the Century," during this, the centennial anniversary of his birth, and expresses its gratitude for Governor Collins' legacy of excellence that has

resulted in the betterment of the lives of Floridians and will continue to do so for generations to come.
