The Committee on Commerce (Sobel) recommended the following:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. (1) A tax levied under chapter 212, Florida Statutes, may not be collected on the sale of a new energyefficient product having a selling price of \$1,500 or less per product from 12:01 a.m., October 1, through midnight, October 31. This exemption applies to products purchased for noncommercial home or personal use, and does not apply to products purchased for trade, business, or resale. As used in

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this section, the term "energy-efficient product" means a dishwasher, clothes washer, air conditioner, ceiling fan, compact fluorescent light bulb, dehumidifier, programmable thermostat, or refrigerator that has been designated by the United States Department of Energy as meeting or exceeding the agency's requirements for energy efficiency or as meeting or exceeding the requirements under the Energy Star Program.

(2) The Department of Revenue may adopt emergency rules to administer this section.

Section 2. For the 2009-2010 fiscal year, the sum \$73,891 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Revenue to implement and administer the energy-efficient products sales tax holiday created in this act. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year a recurring appropriation of \$57,028 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Revenue to administer the energy-efficient products sales tax holiday created in this act.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
