A bill to be entitled

An act relating to injuries to persons riding motorcycles; creating s. 318.195, F.S.; providing that a person who is convicted of a moving violation that causes or contributes to causing serious injury to or the death of a person riding a motorcycle commits a misdemeanor offense; requiring that the offender pay a specified fine, serve a minimum period of incarceration, and attend a driver improvement course; requiring the court to revoke the person's driver's license for a specified period; providing criminal penalties; providing that the act does not prohibit the offender from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 318.195, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

21 318.195 Enhanced penalties for moving violations causing 22 injury or death to motorcyclists.—

(1) A person who is convicted of a moving violation that causes serious bodily injury, as defined in s. 316.1933, to a person riding on a motorcycle commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, and shall pay a fine of not less than \$500, serve a minimum of 30 days of incarceration, and attend a driver improvement course. The court shall also revoke the person's

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driver's license for not less than 30 days.

- (2) A person who is convicted of a moving violation that causes or contributes to causing the death of a person riding on a motorcycle commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, and shall pay a fine of not less than \$1,000, serve a minimum of 90 days of incarceration, and, in lieu of the requirements of s. 322.0261, attend an advanced driver improvement course. The court shall also revoke the person's driver's license for not less than 1 year.
- (3) This section does not prohibit a person from being charged with, convicted of, or punished for any other violation of law.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
