An act relating to protecting urban and residential environments and water; creating s. 403.9335, F.S.; providing a short title; creating s. 403.9336, F.S.; providing legislative findings; creating s. 403.9337, F.S.; encouraging county and municipal governments to adopt and enforce the Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes or an equivalent requirement as a mechanism for protecting local surface water and ground water quality; requiring a county government or municipal government located within the watershed of a water body or water segment that is listed by the Department of Environmental Protection as impaired to adopt the model ordinance; providing that additional or more stringent provisions may be adopted; creating s. 403.9338, F.S.; defining the term "commercial fertilizer applicator"; requiring that a commercial fertilizer applicator obtain training and certification from the Green Industry Best Management Practices program; providing an effective date.

Section 1. Section 403.9335, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

403.9335 Short title.—Sections 403.9335-403.9338 may be cited as the "Protection of Urban and Residential Environments and Water Act."

Section 2. Section 403.9336, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

403.9336 Legislative findings.—The Legislature finds that the implementation of the Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes (2008), which was developed in conjunction with the Florida Consumer Fertilizer Task Force by the department, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, will assist in protecting the quality of Florida's surface water and ground water resources. The Legislature further finds that local circumstances, including the varying types and conditions of water bodies, site-specific soils and geology, and urban or rural densities and characteristics, necessitates that additional or more stringent fertilizer-management practices be implemented at the local government level.

Section 3. Section 403.9337, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

403.9337 Adoption of the Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes.—

- (1) All county and municipal governments are encouraged to adopt and enforce the Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes or an equivalent requirement as a mechanism for protecting local surface water and ground water quality.
- (2) Each county and municipal government located within the watershed of a water body or water segment that is listed by the department as impaired by nutrients pursuant to s. 403.067, shall adopt, at a minimum, the Model Ordinance for Florida-

Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes. However, a county or municipal government may adopt additional provisions to or more stringent provisions than the model ordinance.

Section 4. Section 403.9338, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 403.9338 Commercial fertilizer applicator certification.
- (1) For purposes of this section, the term "commercial fertilizer applicator" means a person who applies fertilizer for payment or other consideration to property that is not owned by the applicator.
- (2) A commercial fertilizer applicator must obtain training and certification from the Green Industry Best Management

 Practices program, which is cooperatively implemented by the department and the Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences at the University of Florida.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
